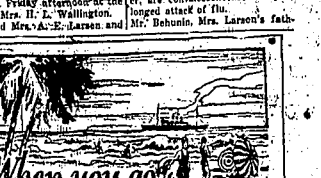

## Four Western States Reveal Figures on Cost of Producing and Raising Sheep—Encouraging to Industry

Four important studies of the cost of raising sheep and the percentage of profit made have been made in recent years by the Idaho, Wyoming, and California state agricultural experiment stations and the United States Department of Agriculture.

While the cost of raising a ewe was only 2.10 as late as 1910, it now goes as high as \$7 and \$10, it is higher in some areas.

These surveys have been made principally through cooperation between state agricultural experiment stations and government departments of agriculture aiding in the work.

The results of the surveys in the Idaho and Wyoming cost of production studies have covered a period of several years and are among the most comprehensive.
