



This is the twentieth year in which Christmas seals have been sold in the United States as a means of combatting tuberculosis. Five years before that they originated in Denmark with the original purpose of spreading Christmas cheer among families where no holiday greet. ings were received...

The man who started the idea died last year, after living to see his entergists result in the feducation of deaths from tuberculosis from 198 per thousand to 88 per thou-sand in this country alone, or's axing of 100,000 lives a year. As a mark of honor, Denmark authorized Christman eals sold in that country to bear the picture of Einor Hoboell to whom the good work is credited.

The seals bear the double-barred cross, the emblem anti-tuberculosis work, and have done more-than anything to curb the spread of the "white plague" throughout the

In Twin Falls county \$2000 will be raised this year for this work. Twin Falls to contribute half that amount. The money is used to provide milk for undernourished school children and to otherwise aid in building up physical strength to prevent tuberculosis from being spread. .
