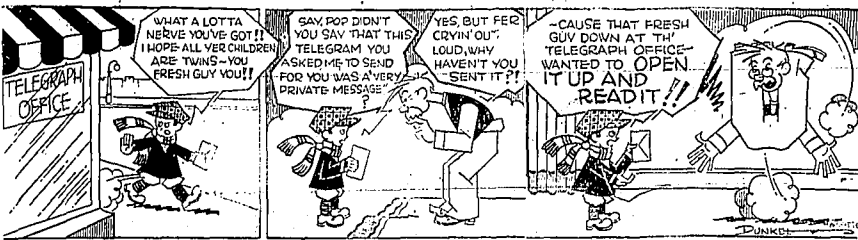

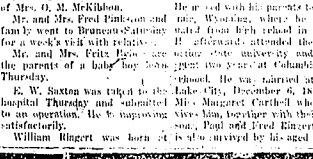

POULTRY HINTS

Start birds on grain and other feeds at a possible advantage, use corn meal.

Build open sheds on tracks to give a shelter as soon as they begin to want to fly up to roost.

Sanitize is an essential in the poultry industry, not only through the use of disinfectants, but also through the use of clean water.

Don't try a little feed unless you have separate space for these birds. These birds are usually very shy and will be better than any other birds in the flock.

Special to keep in mind in feed the birds to the broilers is that they need the ration in question in a good high grade, and feed all just as fully as the broilers.

FARM RELIEF

Senator McNary of Oregon, co-author of the McNary-Haugen bill, is preparing a new farm measure to be submitted on the first day of the special session of congress, April 15. He has invited suggestions from all other farm leaders and will have the support and recommendations of the National Farm Grange, the American Farm Bureau and the Farmers' Union, the three biggest farm organizations in the country.

His new bill is expected to follow the suggestions outlined in one which he submitted at the last session. Senator Pat Harrison of Mississippi favors another equalization fee clause, but this is not expected to get far.

Farm leaders here are awaiting a suggestion from the president but the latter has indicated that he will leave the preparation of farm legislation to the congressional members according to the general suggestions he has made.

Senator McNary will present the matter at a meeting of the agricultural committee March 25 and hopes to have the bill passed early in the special session so its measures will benefit the 1929 crops.

The results of the special session will be awaited with interest.

WORLD'S TAX RECORD BROKEN

In 1927 a new world's record in tax collecting was established in this country when federal, state and local governments required \$9,074,000,000 to keep going. This was 12 per cent of our national income, a two per cent increase since 1923. It is believed that when the statistics for 1928 are gathered we will have definitely exceeded this former high mark. Tax records, unlike other achievements, seldom outlast their year.

An interesting phase of affairs is that the increase in taxes can mainly be laid at the doors of state and local units of government. Federal economies have kept federal taxes fairly constant. The solution, if we can find one, must deal with the unprecedented generosity—or perhaps prodigality—of legislators and state, county, and municipal office holders.

Progress of course costs money. And civic and state spirit, that wants to outdo everything ever done before, is more or less commendable. But community expenditures for luxuries and not essential—bury the taxpayer under a mound of indebtedness that will make progress impossible.

Henry Rheinhardt, chairman of the Associated Dress Industries, Chicago, comes forth with a brand new idea on the most problem of the length of skirts.

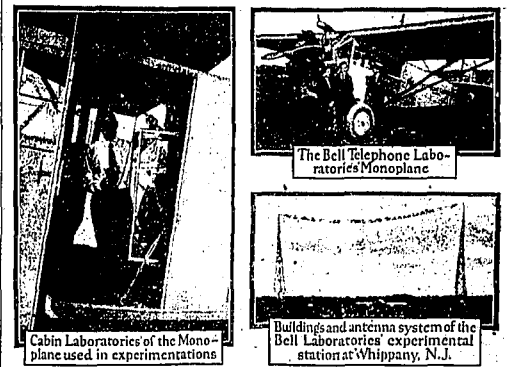

Communication for Plane Navigation Studied by Telephone Engineers

The study of the importance of radio in the practical work of the telephone engineer is such superior to radio-telephone because of the great amount of training required to produce a good telephone operator. In addition to such broadcasting for the benefit of all planes in the air, radio telephony, by which location and direction to fly may be obtained, will be another valuable aid to aviation.

Two-Way Communication
However, for many purposes, two-way communication is more desirable. With this a pilot in the air can speak directly with a meteorologist on the ground and also with other pilots in the vicinity. In case he is instructed to land at another field, due to conditions, he can confirm the radio message by telephone.

Another likely need for two-way communication is in the direction of traffic at busy landing fields where many planes will be taking off and arriving. Here the airport manager may have a radio telephone and instruct pilots by radio where to alight and depart, and what parts of the field to use.

The first step of the telephone engineers in accomplishing such a two-way radio telephone was to construct a field relay along one of the most extensive airways of the country. In the light of these findings they determined the best type of apparatus to build.

Railroad Man Visits Region

Mr. J. Plunhoff, newly appointed general manager of the Oregon & Washington railroad company, Salt Lake City, made a trip over the Rigerson-Wells branch Tuesday and passed the line to see its general condition, adequate to handle an increasing volume of business which he expects to develop in the Twin Falls territory as a result of the improvement in the passenger, freight and express service put into effect not long ago. He was accompanied by W. W. Whit, superintendent of maintenance of way for the Short Line.

It is stated that the Rigerson-Wells road is in good condition and was not seriously affected by the dry drifts and storms of the winter. Agricultural, mining and other enterprises of northern Idaho and northeastern Nevada which tributary to this road were said to offer good prospects for constantly growing shipping business.

An arrangement has been made whereby passengers may secure passage over this road from the Western Pacific at Wells by telegraphing ahead and having the train held a short time.

Never Locate Pastures

Along Running Water

The land and pasture should never be located along a stream and if possible they should be located on the opposite side of the stream. It is not always possible, especially where pasturing is being done, to get the best of both sides of the stream, but it is possible to have the pasture on one side and the stream on the other. This is desirable in extensive log production where the farmer is willing to allow his own cows, but the possibilities of catching log choppers in the stream should be considered carefully in a case of this kind.

Favor Early Operation

On the Young Porks

Castration should be done as early as possible in the life of the pig in order to reduce the possibility of loss of weight and gain in weight following the operation. Also, young pigs are more conveniently handled than older pigs.

If the time is not convenient after the operation, the vaccination should be delayed for ten or fifteen days to let the wounds heal. On the other hand, if vaccination is desired, the operation should not follow until about a month after vaccination.

All animals need direct sunlight.

Better growth and development of young stock will result if they are given a ration which supplies more protein and mineral matter than is needed by the older animals.

Stock frequently suffer from lack of water during the winter weather. When the only water supply available is a stream or spring, daily attention is necessary to be sure that the ice is broken.

Do not neglect the hoof during the winter months. Hoof stock needs special care. For proper growth and development a ration of extra oats and bran or a mixture of extra oats and bran with a feature like a good quality hay is recommended.

Good clean straw bedding is one of the best safeguards that the livestock can use. The best bedding is that which is made of straw and is free from mold and rot. It should be changed every 300 pounds of soiled manure, 50 pounds of manure, and 25 pounds of soil.

Chinese Foods in Cans

Remove the bean sprouts from a can of Sub Kuan and set aside to add at the last. Remove the bean-luon sprouts and water chestnuts from this can and cut in thin slices, then in narrow strips. Add celery, onions, luncheon sauce, water chestnuts and a small piece of ginger root to the skillet together with the juice from the can and two cups of soup stock. Cover and cook until celery and onions are tender. Add one tablespoon flour moistened with a little water, cook until slightly thickened, add one tablespoon brown sauce and more soy sauce, if desired. Add the bean sprouts and heat a few minutes. Serve with hot rice. Any other meat can be used instead of pork.

To convert this recipe into chow mein, open a can of chow mein noodles on a plate and put it in the oven to crisp. Arrange the noodles on a platter, place the chow mein over and—there is chow mein.

Confinement Not Good for the Sheep Flock

Sheep do not thrive so well during confinement and even so, they do not produce more lambs for shelter, as is often said, except during the lambing season. A dry ewe shed, or a ewe with the lamb, will give the most satisfactory shelter. Wet sun and rain are detrimental to the ewe and her lamb, and the lamb will not thrive so well in a shed as in the open field. However, it is said that ewes that are easily shaken off do not breed.

Select for the ewes a lot of land that is well drained. During winter, the sheep will stay in the shed most of the time, particularly so if the shed is kept well lighted, for sheep and like the sun, they feed on a short time before lambing, sometimes losing their lambs, particularly during the winter months, when the ewes are confined in the shed.

Sheep Get Chaff Into Wool Around Hay Stack

Sheep should not be permitted to graze on hay stacks and to get out in any other manner that will permit soil and chaff to get into the wool. It is very difficult for the woolen manufacturer to comb the wool and chaff out of the wool, and this is the case with the wool that is produced by sheep that graze on hay stacks and other vegetation that have fallen in the stack, which contains the wool fibers, which are animal matter.

Dirty Eggs Spoil

Washed eggs are suitable only for immediate consumption, and will not stand up under storage conditions any length of time, although the washed egg may get by for a short time, but is quite unreliable on the fresh egg market. It is preferable to immediately wash the egg after a period of storage. It is advisable to clean the egg and sterilize in the poultry plant to avoid the production of dirty eggs. Eggs, on a farm, should be marketed as fresh.
