

# TWIN FALLS' PARKING PROBLEM

The experiment that is going on in Twin Falls in regard to nutomobile parking on the principal thorough-fares has a number of interesting angles.

Designed to overcome the traffic and congested park ing problems, the new ordinance manifestly has for its purpose the welfare and convenience of the greatest number of persons. Whether or not this is being accomplished, ( depends on the point of view.

The situation now is that cars on Main avenue ex-

tending two blocks each way from the Shoshone street intersection and those on Shoshone street a block each way from Main, may be parked for periods no longer than one hour excepting at night.

The result seems to be this: that business men and tradespeople, whose cars formerly occupied the valuable parking spaces in the congested district, now either leave their machines at home or park outside the one-hour zone. Also, persons from out of town, in order to avoid the pan-Also, persons from out of town, in order to avoid the par-nites of over-parking, also are seeking more distant places, with the result that during the ordinary day, about one-half the available parking space downtown is vacant. The complaint against this is (1) that the city pre-ents a deserted appearance to tourists and others who might become impressed with the business-like appear-

ance of Twin Falls, and (2) that farmers and others now seeking to park outside the one-hour zone, find that bus-iness men and tradesmen have already usurped this space iness men and tradessnen have already usurped this space, of, at least, that many other autolists are likewise seeking these desireable heatinns. The results are then, that the parking problem is transferred from the center of town to points further out.

The one-hour parking limit in the section named is certainly having the effect of keeping the spaces clear, that is subject to this criticism: that one-hour is too short a period. In the majority of cases an hour does not period of a period.

a period. In the majority of cases an hour does not permit of a person attending a show, eating a leisurely meal, or completing a visit to the dentist, the doctor, or lawyer, much less, providing time to shop.

If one hour is not long enough, what about two hours? A parking limit of two hours in the congested district yould drive out the person who wants to park from morning to noon and from noon till night, or the all-day parker. At the same time it would permit visitors to the city to transact their business, whatever it might be, without the necessity of hunting out by-streets, alleys, vacant lots, and other out-of-the-way and distant spaces for their cars.

Two hour purking would tend to keep the now vacant places on, Main and Shoshone filled; if the argument of seening activity has any merit, and we doubt it; and

After all, it's a matter of congratulation to the city of Twin Falls that there is a parking problem. It is a tribute to the popularity of the town as a trading center, and to the prosperity of the people who have so many automobiles that they do not know what to do with them.

That a serious attempt is being made to 'rightly solve' (the problem by the city administration and officials is agong reason for the public assisting in the formulation of an ideal set, of parking regulations. The present ordinance has solved some problems, but it has given rise to some unanticipated additional ones that a two hour law might well accreame.


