Evidence Shows Jack Lemon Had Threatened Defendant's Life, Eight Men Testify for Aged Man

Trial of Daniel P. Moon, 50, first degree murder in the shooting of Jack Lemon July 11, was expected to reach an end about noon Thursday with initial testimony by counsel for the state and the defendant. 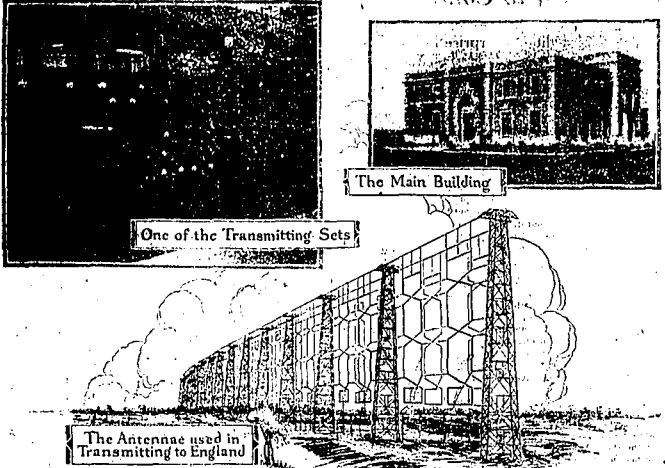

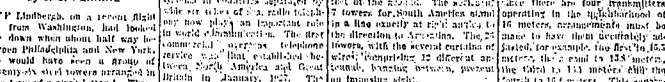

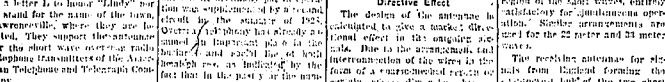

HOME COMFORT SOUGHT

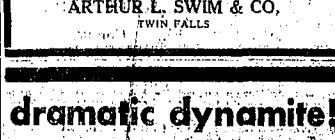
