

## SENATORIAL ETHICS

Senator Bingham, having been consured by the upper house of Congress for conduct "contrary to good mor-als and Senatorial ethics tending to bring the Senate into disrepute," as the resolution of condemnation phrases it. is to be congratulated on the lightness of the penalty sulting from his indefensible course of conduct.

A more sensitive individual, feeling as he announce himself innocent of turpitude, might refuse to sit longe with a body that has such an opinion of him. The Senato from Connecticut, however, purposes continuing a mem-ber of the body at least until his term expires in 1933. Indeed, it is not at all improbable that Bingham will

he reelected if the Republican party continues to prevail in Connecticut. He was picked for the Senatorship by Boss Roraback, who is the Republican Party of Connecticut and who brought about his election before he was in augurated Governor of the State, in which capacity Bing ham served just 24 hours before moving on to the Senate Binghams' allegiance is to Roraback and through him to the Connecticut Manufacturers Association, whose \$10. a year agent he smuggled into the secret hearings of Senate Finance Committee disguised as his secretary. For this moral, if not statutory, crime the Connecticut Sen ator refuses to express any penauce. Obviously, the Manufacturer Association can feel only gratitude for the zeal

and regret only for the detection of the offense.

The letters introduced before the Caraway investigation committee testify to the admiration the Nutmeg State seekers of tariff had for the joint performance of Senator Bingham and their lobby emissary Eyanson. When they congratulated Evanson on having secured "more than they burgained for," never dreaming that that correspondence was to become public, they expressed their view of the functions of a United State Senator.

functions of a United State Senator.
Even the brutally frank declarations of "Old Joe"
Grundy, of Fennsylvania, who told the committee that it
was an outrage that the Senators from the agricultural
States should have as much to do with trafff-making as
the representatives of the large industrial commonwealths, did not make a more definite revelation of the processes of tariff legislation than did the Bingham-Eyanson episode.

Senator Bingham in his defense said "nothing dis honorable or disreputable was attempted. Nothing was done to contrary to good morals or to Senatorial ethics.' Yet Bingham introduced the paid agent of an organiza tion seeking higher tariff rates into sessions of the Fi-nance Committee, which were supposed to be so secrethat even the committee ballots which determined the rates were kept from the Senate and even the Democratic members of the Finance Committee were barred from the hearings. Senator Bingham sees no turpitude in this. It might well be asked why, if his motives were as ingenuous as he pretends, he concealed the identity of his ostensible surretary even from his own colleagues. It was only be-cause of the fortuitous recognition of the identity of the cause of the fortuntous recognition of the identity of the man who sat at his elbow by other members of the committee that prevented Eyanson's presence through the whole of the Finance Committee's long deliberations. The incident was too obviously flagrant for the administration Senators who voted for all the rates Eyanson, through Bingham, presented and they insisted on the lobbyist being left outside.

Bingham's party has a majority of 15 in the U. S Senate, but fewer-than a quarter of the membership of that body voted against the resolution of censure.

Bingham deserved all he got and more, at the hands of the Senate when it censured him.


