DAVIS SAYS PLAN OF OTHER IS POOR

Captain Analyzes "Taxless State" Figures of American Falls Banker

"HAS MILLION DOLLAR REDUCTION" BACKED OFF BOARD.

Strides Additional Quackery as Applied to the Finances of Idaho.

MERIDIAN, Ida.,—At a well attended meeting here Friday night addressed by Captain E. G. Davis, Republican candidate for governor, the speaker took occasion to analyze the "taxless state" proposal of D. W. Davis, the American Falls banker, one of his opponents in the primary. He declared that "tax-a-choice" bit of political quackery. It "has the million dollar reduction" in the cost of state government backed off the board. "The said on this subject: "One of my competitors, Senator D. W. Davis of American Falls, is making his campaign for the nomination of governor on a plan he has elaborated for making Idaho a taxless state. He first gave publicity to the idea and figures at a meeting of the Idaho Bankers' association at Webster, in Jan., 1913, and he has frequently, since that time, addressed various gatherings on the same subject. Speaking generally, this plan, contemplating the sale, within a period of 10 years, of all the land and timber belonging to the state, moving the current cost of our schools with a part of the income, and re-investing the surplus. "According to a statement contained in the writer address, the state was, in 1913, the owner of 2,334,000 acres of unimproved land. Senator Davis would amend the constitution so that all this might be sold as fast as opportunity offers. He estimated that purchasers could be found for three hundred thousand acres per year, and that the whole could be sold within

10 years for not less than \$29,340,000. "True, his figures are based upon the minimum price of \$10 per acre, but it is also true that he supposed it all sold, regardless of legal and other difficulties, and regardless of the fact that much of the land owned by the state may not sell for \$10 per acre within a century. Remembering that the state is now at liberty to sell the timber on any of its lands, and that purchasers are not forthcoming, it is a safe conclusion that the state would have to sell its timber at bargain-counter prices to sell them all within 10 years and that, so sold, they could not be expected to bring much, if any, more than the amount consumed.

"Senator Davis seemed to assume that none of the interest on amounts received from the forced sale of land would be used for current school expenses during the 10-year sale period, for he states that at the end of the period our working capital, after adding the amount on hand in 1913, \$5,500,000, would amount to \$54,017,000. He said: 'We are now entering our eleventh year with a surplus of \$324,000, 10 per cent on the assumed working capital. Now estimating the cost of our school at two million dollars per annum, it leaves us a surplus of \$1,241,000, the which would increase each year by reason of keeping the annual surplus employed.' He added further: 'We would enter our twenty-first year with a fund of \$70,375,000; our thirty-first year with \$93,070,000; our forty-first year with \$170,528,000; our fifty-first year with \$421,836,000; our eighty-first year with \$68,175,000; our ninety-second year with \$930,312,000.'

"The interest on these enormous amounts was expected to pay not only our state taxes, but county and municipal taxes as well, thus making Idaho an absolutely taxless state. But why stop with taxes? These magical figures are now increasing so rapidly that in a few years more than may be made to provide for all our public and private charities, build and furnish our churches and libraries, and above all, return to each taxpayer something in the nature of a dividend on his rights and immunities as a citizen.

"These figures, so advanced, seem to have been generally accepted as correct, and such discussion as I have seen in our newspapers have related not to the economic soundness of the plan but to the policy of its adoption. "It is now time, however, to purchase this financial bubble by showing the extremely erroneous assumption on which it is based. If you have never checked these figures, take your pencil and do so now with me.

"Owing to the necessity of amending the constitution, Senator Davis' 'eleventh year' could not possibly begin before January, 1929. It will be noticed that for this 'eleventh year' he assumed that the total cost of our schools would be only two million dollars.

"Here is the fatal error lying at the base of all his calculations, for even in 1913 the cost of our schools, as shown by the report of the tax commission, was more than double this amount, to be exact \$4,099,441.57, of which amount \$2,703,018.47 were raised by direct taxation and \$1,396,423.10 were derived from interest on the permanent endowments. Senator Davis assumed in his calculations that the cost of our schools would increase for the state as a whole at the rate of fifty thousand dollars per year. Owing to the rapid increase in our population, this amount may not be unreasonable. Assuming this increase for the years following 1912, the estimate cost of our schools for the year 1929, the earliest possible 'eleventh year' of the Davis plan would be, not \$2,000,000 as he assumed, but \$4,894,415.7. After applying his estimated income for that year, \$2,341,000, in part payment of this sum, we would have, instead of a surplus of \$1,241,000, as found by Senator Davis, an actual deficit of \$1,855,415.7.

"The senator's assumption of a surplus was, therefore, fundamentally incorrect, his calculated accumulation was based on error and was fictitious, but the cost of our schools, due to increase in population and other natural causes, will continue to climb. "By the thirtieth-seventh year, our actual, instead of being \$329,313,000, would still be only \$54,017,000. The earnings, at 6 per cent, would still be only \$3,241,000, but the expenses of the schools of the state would have reached at his estimated rate of increase, the enormous sum of \$8,019,441.57. After applying the income of \$3,241,000 the taxpayers of that distant day will still have to raise for school pur-

poses, by direct taxation, \$4,805,441.57, an amount considerably greater than was raised in 1913. They may be well justified in refusing to believe that they are living in a taxless state. "It may be easily calculated that if we are to be fortunate enough to 'break even' on our school expenses for the 'eleventh year' of this new financial plan, we must have for that year an additional capital over that estimated by Senator Davis of \$27,646,992, and even then the taxpayers living in the 'thirty-seventh year' would still have to raise, by direct taxation for school purposes, the tidy sum of \$3,559,000, almost as much as

"The mere statement of these facts, deduced from the senator's figures, after substituting from the records the actual present cost of our schools for his erroneous assumed cost, is sufficient to show the utter fallacy of his conclusion.

"Senator Davis originally made his great mistake nearly three years ago and since that time he has been almost continuously expounding the problem in which it enters without once, apparently, discovering his blunder. These facts must be weighed in their true bearing upon the value of his taxless state delusion on the basis of a campaign for the governorship.

"I am not criticizing Senator Davis personally, but only his ideas. It is my right and duty to do. Neither am I dragging merit for the plan in question, which has been advocated in one form or another from a time antedating the advent of Senator Davis as a citizen of the state. He seems to have added little, if anything, except the delusion I am attempting to correct.

"If the resources of the state are properly administered there is every reason to believe that they will one day provide in large part, for the maintenance of our schools, and reduce our taxes to that extent, but our willing to avoid dealing in political buncombe can safely promise more.

"The state is the owner of a great deal of valuable ripe timber which it may be able to sell before it burns or rots, and again it may not. It has many of its lands tied up in forest reserves which it may get released or exchanged within a reasonable time, and again it may not. No one can say how much these resources will ultimately bring and one guess

may be just as good as another. No one can tell when purchasers may be found for them all and here again all guesses are of equal value. The only vital point about the whole matter is that our resources should be converted into cash or its equivalent, as fast as can now be done at fair market value and to meet legitimate demands, in order that our schools may be made as nearly self supporting as possible as we go along. I am more interested in seeing that those who are living in Idaho today get some relief from the burdens of taxation than that those who may be living here ninety or a hundred years from now shall have any at all.

"At the next election the voters will pass upon a proposed constitutional amendment authorizing the sale of one hundred sections of school land instead of 25 as at present. There being no present restriction on the sale of our timber, it may be that the adoption of this amendment will secure the sale of our resources fast enough to meet all legitimate demands for years to come. No one should advocate anything beyond this.

"As a choice bit of political quackery this taxless state nonsense has the million dollar reduction in the cost of state government backed off the boards." Boise Statesman.

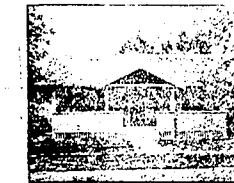

BUHL IN SHORT TIME

County Agriculturalist Asks All Interested to Let Him Know—Many Stories Given.

The county agriculturalist, W. N. Duck, in planning a silo excursion for about April 1, exact date to be published later. The plan is to start out from Twin Falls in the morning and proceed to Buhl and return, visiting silos on the way. There will be automobiles from Buhl to join in the procession advances. The county agriculturalist, and probably others, will expect to accompany Twin Falls people to Buhl and return. The best part of this will be that anyone considering a silo will have an opportunity to talk with owners of silos, look over their herds and judge what the silage is doing.

The county agriculturalist will appreciate it if all who care to take this trip will in the next few days, telephone him (Phone 712) or write him at Twin Falls, in order that he may estimate the number who will want transportation. He will especially appreciate it if owners of automobiles who can go will notify him in advance and carry some others who have no means of production, who expresses a desire to take in this trip will receive a special notice of the date so that no one may be left at home.

Speaking on the subject of silage, Mr. Duck says: "During the last two years' yield of silage from the Twin Falls county has been from six to twenty-two tons the average being twelve and a half tons per acre. Only one man furnished data regarding cost of production. He gave each acre \$5.55 worth of labor, and produced 18.3 tons, making an average cost per ton of 30 cents. The cost of silage has varied from 56 cents to \$1.83 per ton, the average being 96 cents per ton. It is supposed that the man who gave the silage at 56 cents was a man who filled at 56 cents, so that his silage when in the silo owed him \$1.03 per ton for labor. No account was kept here of rent, water or taxes, which are about the same for all crops. It is understood that some silage is being produced and stored at less cost under \$2.00 per ton and one can reasonably expect to keep this cost under \$3.00.

In one instance this feed increased the herd's products, valuing skim milk at 25 cents per hundred and butterfat at 76 cents per pound, \$1.18 per ton of silage fed. At the same time it saved 330 pounds of mixed grain and 600 pounds of hay. Valuing grain at one cent per pound and hay at \$5.00 per ton, we have a saving of \$4.95 worth of feed. Adding increased product and feed saved, we find a ton of silage worth \$1.13. That appears to be a high price, but just suppose it has been saving \$1.25 grain and \$10.00 hay!

This is probably the best record in the county, but nearly every man who owns a silo will say that he would not consider doing without it. Besides the saving of other feeds, the silage keeps in good health and is convenient to feed. There is no hauling in bad weather. It helps to balance the ration with alfalfa and clover which are so abundant in this section.

The following figures taken from the records of the Buhl Pioneer Cow Testing association are worthy of notice. This first column shows the total number of cows making 40 pounds or more of butterfat per month. The second shows the number of those on the silage farms. The third shows the per cent on silage farms.

It is probable that no silage was fed in October, and little in November, but in good feed at that time the percentage of silage fed cows is larger every month as winter progresses. The reasons are that the silage fed cows are getting a ration that they enjoy, one that balances nicely with hay. They are not tired of winter feeds as the dry fed cows, and as a consequence are keeping up their production here.

There is not space here to go into the matter of silage for other than dairy cows. At the same time, it is excellent for breeding and fattening sheep, young cattle, beef cows and fattening steers.

E. V. Ellington, professor of dairying at the university, in compliance with a request made by the county agriculturalist, has authorized Carl A. Harder of Twin Falls, to test advanced registry in this county. This gives the breeders in this locality an opportunity to get advanced registry tests at a considerable saving in comparison to what they would have to pay if a tester were brought from a distance.

PROSPECTS BRIGHT FOR MINING CAMP

Better Road, More Mills and Plenty of Ore in Sight

MUCH DEVELOPMENT CARRIED ON DURING WINTER MONTHS

Camp Survives Severe Winter. Mills Were Forced to Close. Highway to Twin Falls Only One Kept Open.

Jarbridge is pushing steadily towards the town as a mining camp, possibly not with sensational speed, but steadily and surely. During the past winter development work on different properties was pushed as it never has before. The winter months have been made for better mill facilities, and highways will be improved to meet the increasing demands for better transportation. JARBRIDGE, NEVADA, MARCH 7.—The outlook for the future of Jarbridge camp is very promising. There is little doubt that all the mills in the district will be running full capacity as soon as the weather conditions will permit. The development of ore reserves during the winter has been most satisfactory and it is expected that those properties which have mills will make a good showing of bullion this season. While no new mills will be built and contracted for.

The winter has been the most severe on record in the camp; a large amount of snow has fallen which has piled up in places by a very severe wind. The roads have been in a state of disrepair, necessitating considerable shoveling. The road between here and Twin Falls has been kept open all the time for delivering freight into camp but the roads up to the mills and mills were too badly drifted to warrant trying to keep open. All the mills depend on oil fuel for power and as it costs too much to get oil to the mills they have all been closed down for awhile.

Except during the winter months Jarbridge has good connections with both Elko and Twin Falls; the road from Elko through Jarbridge to Twin Falls is a most scenic route. The development of the Long Ilke property is demonstrating what practical and systematic work will do and makes the future outlook for Jarbridge very bright. The Long Ilke vein was discovered and opened up on the surface near the upper part of the Long Ilke ground, and a tunnel run for a short distance with encouraging showings. Then another tunnel was run in about 150 feet lower down to intersect the vein which was drilled off for some distance with somewhat better showings than was found above; then a tunnel was run another 150 feet further down the hill, where the showing was still better. Here the drift ran for 250 feet with a vein in places of 16 to 20 feet and average values of \$20 to \$30 per ton. A fourth tunnel is now being run 150 feet further down the hill which will give nearly 600 feet of back, which is just getting into the vein. When this drift is run through the ore body and the different levels connected, values exposed will reach up into the millions. With this showing there will be ample warrant for the expenditure of large sums of money for power and mill equipment. Record progress has been made with the tunnel work on the Long Ilke vein, the average being eight to ten feet per shift. One week recently, with three shifts the tunnel was advanced 77 feet.

The Flaxie company is in the last of a three shift prospecting mill last fall and have been running through some of the high grade ore, but the results with this small mill have not been very satisfactory as it is only possible to handle the highest grades of ore. It is probable that a larger mill will be arranged for this summer which will enable the whole body of ore to be treated. Considerable development work has been done on this ore body, and the results are very promising. The average value of the ore is about \$15 per ton, although the high grade streak shows much of picture ore, but this mill has always been noted for.

The legitimate mine is being extensively developed and a fine chute of ore has been exposed on the 100 foot level. Always show very promising values and the last cross cut showed a width of 15 feet. The people who are working this property have done a large amount of prospecting in the camp, and they are highly pleased that they have at last secured such a promising mine and that their abilities are that before the season is so far advanced they will have enough ore in sight to call for a small mill.

The Alpha tunnel has been worked out on a continually all winter and the workings show that it is approaching the ore chute which yielded such rich ore in the summer. The Alpha mine is being worked by a number of miners under lease and the results are of the most satisfactory nature. A considerable amount of ore has been opened from winter a very substantial profit is expected as a result of their winter work. A short mill run was made in the winter which yielded sufficient gold to pay the expenses.

The O. K. property has been quite extensively opened up and is making a creditable showing. This mine is under the same management as the Long Ilke.

The Hoarue mine is being operated by a new company under lease and bond. A change was made in the mill and the chute has been changed. The mill is now running on \$12 to \$15 ore and considerable quantity of ore is in sight in the mine, while considerable development work has been done. A new tunnel from the level of the top of the mill which is in about 150 feet should soon be in ore and will give about 200 feet of back.

On the Elmore about five feet of vein matter has been opened which runs well. The Buckeye is showing up some rich ore and the ore chute has been raised on and the two tunnel levels are nearly connected. The leasers of this mine will have a nice body of ore to run through their Arrastra as soon as the weather conditions permit.

At the Success very little new work has been done but the vein has been kept up in good shape and several hundred thousand dollars worth of ore are estimated in sight in the several ore chutes already opened. This is one of the promising properties of the camp it is understood that several parties who have had examinations made are favorably impressed with same. If a good strong company takes hold of this mine there will soon be another mill in line for the future.

The Bluster Consolidated Mining company closed its mill when the conditions of the roads made the expense of hauling to the mill too great. Besides the cold weather made it hard to hold the tailings and there were other expenses and losses that made it advisable to close the mill until the weather conditions were more favorable. It was also considered more advisable to install the cyanide solution to the mill before treating more ore and thus save much of the loss that has been accumulating in that tailing pond. Development work has been prosecuted in the mine, some rich ore having been encountered in the new workings.

The leasers on the Pick and Shovel after making a very successful short run with their mill, closed the mill down owing to the difficulty of hauling the ore from the mine down to the mill; the development work in the mine has been pushed and several ore chutes are well opened up so that a very satisfactory amount of ore is in sight ready for the mill when it becomes practicable to start it again. A snow slide occurred on the Homann

which will enable the whole body of ore to be treated. Considerable development work has been done on this ore body, and the results are very promising. It is therefore probable that there will be less slides than usual, and an advantage will accrue from the fact that the snow will melt very slowly and will keep up the supply of water late in the season.

BIG SHEEP SHIPMENT GOES OUT OF JEROME

JEROME: On last Saturday Newman brothers shipped fourteen cars of sheep from Jerome, reports the North Side News. These sheep were mostly yearlings, just about a year old, and will be marketed at Sacramento, California, to be finished for about thirty days on corn before going into the Chicago market. Before being marketed they will also be sheared.

Each car contained 250 sheep so there were about 3,500 in the shipment. The sheep were grades and would average about 20 pounds each in the condition they were when shipped. Of course they will be in much better condition when they go on the market. At the price in Chicago on a day of shipping, the value of the sheep would be worth about \$25,000 at the stockyards.

The sheep were wintered on the farms about Jerome on North Side. Illinois, and had come through the winter in good shape. The shipment went out over the Oregon Short line and made about a train load.

EXIT ALL TRADING STAMPS.

We can not help but feel that the merchants of this city acted wisely in discarding the trading stamp idea, as reported elsewhere in this issue of THE TIMES.

The "Something for Nothing" fallacy has been purchased so many times on comment on it seems superfluous. The ending is always the same; disappointing idea to purchaser and seller.

The average man or woman buys a thing because he needs or wants the article to be purchased; and he is willing to pay what he regards a reasonable price. He does not need nor he does not want the premiums that he is obliged to buy along with the article he does want. He would take them as a gift, to be sure, but he knows very well that they are not being given to him as a gift; on the contrary, that he is simply being forced to buy them along with his other purchases.

Competition in all lines of business is a great leveller of prices. The public perhaps benefits by the trading stamp policy when first inaugurated, but only a short time elapses before the retailer adjusts his prices to include the additional expense the premium trading stamp plan entails. This is inevitable.

That local merchants gave the plan a fair trial is an indication of their enterprise. That they have now abandoned it after a fair trial and after it had been demonstrated unsound by actual experience, is an intelligent and progressive act.

It might be added that THE TIMES backs up this opinion by practice. We do not oblige subscribers to pay us for seasons, maps, plates or calendars when they come in to buy a year's subscription to our paper. We sell them what they want, and much prefer to put the cost of such articles as some newspapers sell with subscriptions, into the paper itself, making it of, as far as we are able, a bigger better and brighter paper.

NEGLIGENCE AND THE PUBLIC HEALTH

Somebody has evidently been remiss in the performance of duty in regard to the order of the county requiring the muzzling of dogs. From the informal discussion at the court house the other day between the chairman of the board of county commissioners and the county attorney, wherein it developed that the county attorney had refused to prosecute owners of dogs who refused to obey the order on the grounds that he had been unable to discover any record that the county board of health (the same as the board of commissioners) had ever passed such an order.

This matter, like all pertaining to the public health, is of paramount importance. The case of the Douglas hog, at Haggard and the recent invasion of Rogerson by a mad coyote is indication enough that hydrophobia is still rampant in the county. The situation will probably continue serious until the coyotes have been exterminated either by the efforts of the county or as the result of the ravages of the disease. Failure to keep dogs muzzled may have direst consequences to men, women and children, and to cattle as well.

In view of the terrible results that might follow from the failure of any one to comply with the muzzling order, it is unfortunate that the records appear irregular in this matter. It is to be hoped that no serious results will follow this unfortunate circumstance. Probably none of the dogs whose owners refused to comply will go mad; and if they unfortunately should it is to be hoped that they confine their activities to their misguided and arbitrary owners.

In the city of Twin Falls owners of dogs must keep their dogs muzzled or prosecution will follow, as Mayor Sweeley informs us that the city's records are entirely complete and regular, and that the ordinance is being and will continue to be enforced.

Incidentally we would suggest that until the present situation is relieved that farmers refrain from using their dogs to assist in the handling of stock.

CAMERA MAN RISKS

LIFE TO MAKE PICTURE

The most daring feat performed by a movie camera man was credited to Rial Schellinger who photographed many of the scenes in the William Fox production of "The Mother's Secret" the big film at the Isis theatre Monday and Tuesday evenings. One of the "location" scenes by Director Frederic Thomson was a narrow cleft which had worn its way for some distance into the face of a huge rock formation on the shore. Only by placing the camera on the narrow part of the recess, which practically amounted to a cave, could the desired result be obtained.

Even at low tide the water rushed into the opening with such force that a man could not stand on the bottom and keep his feet, and so tripod had been built which could have withstood the sea's fury at that particular spot.

Making use of what material they had at hand, the cameramen with the company built a light framework, fastened the moving picture camera to it and then lowered the framework until

its ends rested on the side walls of the caving. The framework was so light to support a man, so Schellinger, with a massive bag of sand attached to each foot, was lowered, waist deep into the water, behind the camera, by means of a rope.

With the sand bags resting on the sea floor and serving as anchors and with the rope overhead, the bold Rial Schellinger was enabled to keep near enough to the framework to turn the camera crank with the required regularity. He was four minutes in photographing the scene. If, during that time, his foot ballast had become disconnected, the waves would have swept him back to instant death against the jagged rocks before his companions could have hauled him from his perilous position.

PERSIAN WALNUTS WEALTH-PRODUCERS

be produced in mutton from the pasture of the best acre of pasture land in England. I do not know how to put the thing more strongly. Language could not convey the idea more emphatically. Now, consider the situation. English and French walnuts grow well in this country only in a narrow strip in California. Consider the amount of food that can be produced from a walnut that will grow in this northern climate and produce such fruit as has been grown in the Blue Lake farm. The Persian walnut is grown largely in China, where it produces well in the cold country north of Peking. It has rich, sweet meat, with a firm and moderately thick shell and is a beautiful nut. I took two of them to Luther Burbank and gave them to him, asking him to try them. He ate one and said that it was the best nut that he ever tasted and that he would not take \$20 for the other one as he intended to take it home and plant it. It is a tree that is free from pests and requires no spraying, is strong and healthy, has a heavy product, thirty-two percent

can be grown on one acre of ground; and when the statement of the French scientist in regard to the food producing qualities of a single tree compared with the best acre of English pasture is recalled, you begin to get some idea of what its culture would mean. It could be planted along ditches and waste places and be profitable for the post, where the soil is deep enough.

"The market for walnuts is unlimited, and there are practically no Persian walnuts grown in this country, as indicated by the fact that the agricultural department has applied to Mr. Purvis for buds. I consider it one of the greatest wealth producers that could be cultivated on the Twin Falls tract, where the soil and water are both so abundant.

"Another product recently brought to the tract through the experiments of the department of agriculture is ladino clover. You will not find the name in any book on agriculture in this country. It is an importation from the European plateau regions, and grows exclusively in Switzerland and Italy. It is the most palatable of all clovers and produces 200 pounds of seed to the acre in this country. Over 100 acres have already been planted and as it grows to more than twice the height here that it does in its native country its successful cultivation on the tract is no longer a matter of doubt.

Of course, Mr. Grubb is at home in discussing the potato but his experiments with the spud is an old tale. He has written a book on the subject, which has been translated into many tongues and is quoted as authority everywhere. Mr. Grubb has traveled around the world several times visiting the leading agricultural institutions of all civilized lands, consulting and being consulted. He is now on his way home to his famous farm at Gardendale, Colorado, after the completion of a special trip through California teaching the leading dining car chefs how to select and prepare potatoes as an expert of expertise. He is still devoted to the potato which he declares is the food that may win the war for Germany unless there are enough Mike O'Learys to go from the favorite adopted home of the potato to the battle front. He says that one pound of potato furnishes as much wholesome and nutritious human food as eight eggs, and quotes leading physicians to endeavor to show that the denunciation of the potato as a food, and the fact which was taken up by the mediaeval heavy-product, thirty-two percent

which has discouraged its cultivation in this country, is a mistake. But to hear Mr. Grubb on potatoes is an education in itself and justice cannot be done to the subject within the limits of a single newspaper interview. Mr. Grubb has two farms on the North Side; one at Eden and one at Hazelton, and has also a farm on the Salmon tract.

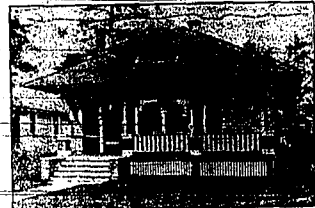

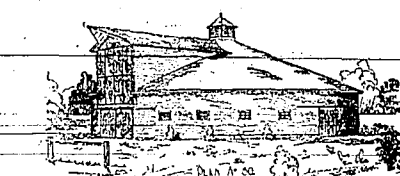

THE POWERFUL OLIVER SERMON DELIVERED AT THE TABERNACLE SUNDAY MORNING

ALL of the kings of Europe were assembled in London tonight and I should present the question, "Do you think Jesus Christ will return to earth soon?" The unanimous answer would doubtless be, "We think not." If our President should call the two legislative bodies into a conference and have the governors of all the states and mayors of all the great cities and the question, "Do you think Jesus Christ will return to earth within a short time?" should be presented, the conference would be hastily adjourned. They would say, "We think not." I will go further: If all the ministers of the Gospel were called together in one gigantic conference and were asked the same question, I think the majority of them would say, "We do not expect Him."

But the text I have chosen for this address which is recorded in Matthew 24:44, "Therefore be ye always ready, for the Son of Man cometh," it is pathetic when you consider the fact that the second coming of Christ is mentioned about five times in the Bible. The first coming is mentioned once, that so many of the people who believe that He is a Man of Sorrows and died on the cross to save sinners are not only in the dark concerning the fact of His return, but they are bitterly opposed every reference to His imminent and glorious return.

Nevertheless, He is coming. "Behold He cometh with clouds, and every eye shall see Him, and they which pierced Him, and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of Him" (Rev. 1:7). But before He comes to inaugurate the Millennium, to execute judgment upon the Gentile world-system, which is owned root and branch by the Devil, He is coming secretly to call His disciples, and His call of the saints will inaugurate the beginning of the missing week of Daniel's prophecy, of the seventh week, which is so vital in moment, so tremendous in warning, so terrible in the inauguration of trouble and bloodshed. (Dan. 12:1.)

Lack of Vision

Christ's reference to the condition of the church as His appearing is made very clear in His parable of the Ten Virgins—five were foolish and five were wise. It seems to indicate the lack of vision and spiritual union on the part of the blind leaders and the blind followers of churchianity, who have misinterpreted formally for regeneration and grace and undefined religion. The current phrase on the part of modern religious leaders has been worn threadbare, the statement, "I am an optimist; the world is getting better." It has been worked overtime. There is such a thing as intelligent optimism, but it is absolutely different from blind and consummate ignorance. I heard of a man in New York not long ago who was a vocal optimist. He fell from the fifty-sixth story of the Woolworth Building. Somebody asked him why he passed the thirtieth story. "Everything is perfectly lovely, so far," and that seems to indicate the optimism of the false religionists of our time. They are dropping into the blackness of doubt and do not know their danger. When I talk men and women for proof that the world is getting better, they mention "Peace conferences" and they get so excited that a week before the next European war begins they are saying that there will never be another great war; that men were educated far beyond such brutality, and the two or three great exploits of the peace propaganda in America are men who have the duty of the Prince of Peace and absolutely reject Him as Lord and King. I want to say to you that it is utterly impossible to have peace on the earth of a permanent order until Jesus Christ returns to earth and establishes His kingdom of peace. When people refer to the great strides of civilization as an indication that the world is getting better and point to the marvelous achievements of German educators, I desire to say that the best-versed theologians of Germany have done more to preach infidelity in the form of the Higher Criticism into the world during the past forty years than all other educators combined.

Education Falls

I had a letter from the highest authority in one of the great denominations in regard to the condition of the colleges of our country. He said that in spite of education, in spite of the advance in science and philosophy, art, literature and all learning, crime was increasing at a greater rate than ever before in the history of America. The current idea concerning the Millennium is that by the process of evolution the world is to be made better gradually, that the Gospel is the heaven that leaveth the whole lump and the world is the lump, and the process will ultimately end in the complete conversion of all men and women of the earth and it will become so righteous that Jesus will be drawn back to earth to establish His kingdom.

The Bible does not touch anything bordering on to this current heresy; it touches absolutely the opposite; the authority of Jesus Christ is the best authority in the universe. He will enter His testimony, "And many false prophets shall rise and deceive many, and because iniquity shall abound, the love of the Lord shall be cold, and this Gospel of the

kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations, and then shall the end come" (Matt. 24:14). The Gospel only comes to the "leave" in the sense of unbelief; the process is a process of disintegration. It is not a process of "chemistry" of preservation. Certainly the Son of God was not an ignoramus in regard to the process of heaven in its action. The heaven of the Pharisees was a destructive principle which absolutely ruined spirituality and caused them to become bitter assassins. The Scripture says very plainly that "Seducers shall wax worse and worse," that there shall arise false Christs and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, inasmuch that if it were possible they shall deceive the very elect. The falling away from the truth into absolute apostasy is predicted by the Apostle Paul as well as other inspired writers: "But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, receiving and being deceived." "This know also that in the last days perilous times shall come, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unlovely, without natural affection, true breakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, traitors, head-high, high-minded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God; having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof; from such turn away." This prophecy is fulfilled in our days. There are false teachers and apostate preachers who substitute the form of Godliness for the power thereof. They build dance halls in connection with their churches, and make a trap-door into hell out of the institution they call the church. Such churches are religious garbage cans. Such preachers are ecclesiastical buzzards carrying off the carcasses of those who are too slow to repent and be converted and live clean lives.

The Record

Look at the record made by those who have deliberately rejected the revealed truth of the Bible concerning the deity of Jesus Christ and redemption through His atoning and redeeming blood. Consider the frightful apostasy of any number of English and German and American preachers who have turned their backs upon the truth. Those of Thomas Paine, Voltaire or Robert Ingersoll. Take the present status of the church membership in America; the majority of churches seem to have reached the Laodicean period. "They are neither cold nor hot." They have settled down in the nauseating, lukewarm condition described in the third chapter of Revelation.

Persecution purified the church. When the church traveled through fire, or through water, or through blood, her testimony shook the world, when the church became rich and said, "I am rich, I need nothing, they have lost her power; and the head of the church, Jesus Christ, declares He will spare the church out of His mouth. He is not referring to those who are clean and pure in heart, but He is referring to that tremendous multitude of unregenerated, unsprited, godless people in the church who refuse to be led into a knowledge of the truth.

The majority of church members in this city never try to lead a soul to Christ from one year's end to the other. Can you show me one of them, or tell me their peculiarities?" The planter pointed to an object in a distant field and said, "Do you see that brown object? That may be a stump or it may be a 'cracker.' You stand here and watch it for thirty minutes. If it moves, it is a stump."

In Atlanta some time ago they had a plague of smallpox and they vaccinated all of the negro school children. The doctor came to one little boy and asked him if he had been vaccinated. He answered, "Yes, sir, I've been vaccinated and baptized both, but it didn't take." And that is the trouble with the godless crowd in the church. They are willing to run the gamut of forms and ceremonies. They have a form of godliness but they deny the power thereof.
