### INLAND NORTHWEST

Nevada is now losing more livestock from pest poisoning than from infectious diseases.

Robert William Parry, a state pioneer and one of the best known men in Nevada, died at Reno last week after an illness extending over months.

An unidentified man was found by a shepherd in the hills near Reese station, Nevada. A coroner's jury returned a verdict of "death from unknown cause."

Social gatherings around a can of beer in alleyways must end in Reno, since the chief of police, J. D. Hilthouse, is issuing orders to the men on the police force.

The Junior aviators of Beehive girls of Panaca, Nevada, are not sewing shirts for soldiers, but they are doing one thing better—they are knitting sweaters for the men of the navy.

Leslie Kaiser, a workman, was killed and a grating mill was blown to atoms when more than half a ton of black powder was exploded accidentally at the Dupont Powder plant near Tacoma.

John Olinagan, who was confined for a long time with a broken neck in St. Mary's hospital in Goldfield and for whom the people of that city have evidenced great interest, will recover without an operation, it is announced.

Professor Jensen, principal of the Eiko high school, has been called to assist the University of California in the organization of an officers training camp which will be conducted for the seven weeks of the summer session.

First efforts to encourage the propagation of song birds in Reno have been taken by the boys of the manual arts department in the grade schools of the city, who are building up bird houses for distribution in various parts of the city.

Members of the newly formed Metal Mine Workers' union, after having had their demands for higher wages and improved working conditions refused by the mining companies at Butte, have distributed circulars calling on the miners to strike quietly.

Charging that officials intimidated him and forced him to sign a document setting forth that he was not a prospector for illegal incarceration, Emil J. Deuble, a Caliente business man, has brought suit for \$25,000 against a number of officials.

Awards of \$3000 each, were made by the Nevada Industrial commission to Mrs. W. L. Hokey and Mrs. Mordecai Taylor as compensation for the death of their husbands. Taylor and Hokey were killed May 10 while on a shift at the Ponnington lens plant near Yerington.

Conviction of J. B. Dixon, former Reno attorney, in the second district court of Nevada, on charges of violating law without first procuring a quarterly license, has cost the County of Washoe for jury fees alone the sum of \$411. Dixon said that he intends to appeal the decision.

**Rosebud Satchet.**

An unusual satchet which would be very attractive for the hat-box or to keep among linens, is a tiny bunch of rosebuds, such as are used for decorating bouquet vases, negligees, etc.

The heart of each rose, before being collected should be filled with muslin. In the satchet, in a cluster of eight or nine roses, the satchet will be large enough to impart a delicate fragrance.

A satchet of this sort is extremely dainty and the rosebuds the most easily manipulated of all the ribbon flowers. The ribbon should be an inch wide and sewed into a little pocket at one end of the satchet, then wrapped around and around until it is the correct size. A few leaves, cut out of green velvet, will be an attractive contrast.



Who's Who Behind the Scenes in the War Army

By GEORGE GARVIN Staff Correspondent, International News Service Maj. Gen. Hugh L. Scott, Chief of General Staff, Born September 22, 1853, in Kentucky, and appointed to the military academy in 1871 from New Jersey.

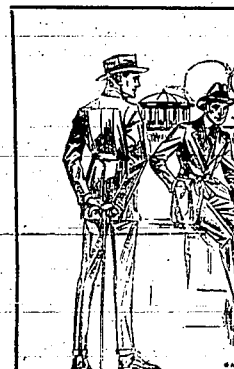
