Election Bet Litigation at Trial—Jury To Bring in a Sealed Verdict Today.

Following the completion of arguments last evening the case of Minnie Hays against C. A. Robinson was given to the jury with instructions to bring in a sealed verdict this morning.

Presentation of evidence started yesterday morning. The case involves the ownership of an automobile wrenched at the last general election by J. W. Hays, husband of the plaintiff.

According to the evidence introduced the bet was made between Mr. Hays and Mr. Robinson with Mr. Hays assuring Mr. Robinson that the car was his property. It was the contention of the plaintiff that the car belonged to Mrs. Hays and that she knew nothing of the election bet and had not acquiesced in the wager.

The defendant introduced evidence to show that Mrs. Hays had knowledge of the bet, it being alleged that she had conversed and joked about the wager was made. It was contended that remarks were made that the Hays would have two cars after the election.
