HINDENBURG evidently is preparing for a blow at the British line in Flanders.

Haig, in his official report, described a heavy bombardment on the eleven mile line between Armentieres and the La Bassee canal today. The former place is only a mile south of the Belgian frontier, and La Bassee is five miles north of Lens, the previous northern extremity of the German of-

fensive.




