PAN MOTOR DEAL UNFAIR CHARGE

Campaign to Eliminate Alleged Misrepresentation Is Begun by United States.

WASHINGTON, (AP)—The Pan Motor company of St. Cloud, Minn., and its president, Samuel C. Pandolfo, were cited today by the federal trades commission to answer a complaint, the first issued in the government's campaign to eliminate misrepresentation and unfair practices in the interstate sale of stocks and securities. Hearings will be held here July 10.

The complaint alleges the concern has taken in \$4,732,811 from the sale of stock.

False Advertising Alleged
The complaint charges that the stock in question was sold from the incorporation of the company in January, 1917, to February 28, 1919, and that its president, with the effect of deceiving the public, circulated throughout the country false, misleading and unfair advertisements and statements concerning the assets, resources, progress and financial standing of the company.

American Officers in British Schools

Two Thousand Are Detached in Order to Attend University Lectures in England.

LONDON, (AP)—(Correspondence of the Associated Press)—Two thousand young American military officers, who have been detached from their units in order that they may attend lectures in the leading universities of the British Isles, are proceeding this knowledge by seeing some of the countless points of interest with which the country abounds.

London is their favorite "hunting" ground. Westminster Abbey, St. Paul's Cathedral, the Houses of Parliament, the Tower and Buckingham Palace early claimed their attention. They then turned to the residences of Dickens, Johnson and others whom they looked upon as old friends.

Are Extending Search
Now that spring has come they are extending their search to the London suburbs and to other parts of the country.

Yesterday numbers of the student officers sought such places at Hampton Court and Kew Gardens, famous to the world over for their various and beautiful foliage. Many of them are engineers, and with a thrifty thought for the future slung their cameras over their shoulders and prepared to preserve for future reference such bits of landscape gardening as caught their individual fancy. But in this they were disappointed, and the student and active guards at the Kew gate temporarily collected the cameras and told them Sunday photography was forbidden in Kew.

Take Many Trips
Journeys into Scotland and Ireland interest many of the men and they return to London as a rule, pleased with the people and with their treatment. The start is usually made from the busy Euston station at noon, and Tuesday night usually finds them back in the city ready for work.

A dozen or more of them spent a recent Sunday at Killiney and, desiring to go through the Gap of Dun Linn, arranged with their landlord for donkeys at \$1.25 each for the journey of six "Irish" miles. When they reached the Gap they were hailed with delight by the donkey boys who, seeing they were Americans and believing Americans carried nothing but gold pieces in their pockets, put up the price of donkeys to \$5. The officers, after a vain parley, walked through the Gap.

Visit Big Towns

Manchester, Birmingham, Leeds and Liverpool, with their great manufacturing and shipping interests, also claim attention, particularly from officers who are studying industrial and commercial questions, while the fishing industry of the north Sea ports is attracting others. In this last, however, they admit the trips are much more for pleasure than they are for profit.

The lectures will continue through June, and by that time, some of the more industrious travelers predict, they will know a good deal about Great Britain and that they explain, is why they were sent here.

TARIFF ISSUE BOBS UP AGAIN

Chairman Fordney of Ways and Means Committee to Have Hearing on Dyes.

WASHINGTON, (AP)—First steps toward drafting tariff legislation will be begun Tuesday by the house ways and means committee, Chairman Fordney announcing today that hearings would be started then to determine what legislation is necessary to protect the American dye industry that sprang up during the war. He said a separate measure, relating only to this industry, would be drafted by the committee, and that hearings probably would continue several days.

FINE CUP FOR RACE WINNER

Thoroughbred Horseman's Association Puts Up Trophy at Jockey Club.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., (AP)—Members of the Thoroughbred Horseman's association at a meeting here voted \$1000 for the purchase of a cup to go to the winner of the Kentucky Jockey Club stakes.

The stakes will have a value of \$35,000 of which \$10,000 is added money. It will be for two-year-olds and will be run for the first time in the fall, either at Latonia or at Churchill Downs.

It will be eclipsed in importance only by the reopening of the Latonia championship stakes, which also will be run in the fall at Latonia. It will have a total valuation of approximately \$50,000, of which \$15,000 is added. It will be for three-year-olds at a mile and three-quarters.

Entries closed last year and will close for the 1921 running June 20 next.

California League Prepares to Dissolve

SAN FRANCISCO, (AP)—The Central California Baseball league evidently is not the success which was expected by its promoters as there are well defined rumors that the schedule of games will not be played out. It is expected the teams in the league will play independent ball.

One of the principal reasons given for the lack of interest in the league is the fact that the teams are not well balanced, three of them being so much superior to the other three that spirited contests are not possible. Crockett, Pittsburg and Richmond clubs have won hollow victories from the teams of Alameda, Bethlehem, Unions and St. Dominics.
