ORD FRENCH ESCAPES BULLET FIRED BY IRISH ASSAILANTS

Abortive Attempt is Made on Life of Lord Lieutenant of Ireland; Assassins' Fire is Returned by Military Escort Summoned by Woman Wotor Car Driver and Two Casualties Result; Intense Excitement Prevails as Tanks Appear in Dublin Streets

DUBLIN, (F).—An attempt was made at 1 o'clock this af-ternoon to assassinate Viscount French, the lord lieutenant of Ireland.

Lord French was driving between the Ashdown gate of Phoenix Park and the vice regal lodge when a shot was fired. A civilian nearby was struck and instantly killed by the bullet. A policeman was wounded at the same time. Lord French, however, escaped the shot evidently intend-

Countess Laszio Stechenyi, who formerly was Miss Gladry Vanderbilk, has arrived from Europe with her four children-Cornelius, ten years old; Alice, eight; Claudia, six, and Sylvia. ten months. The countess, who by her marriage, became an Austrian subject and, therefore, technically is an enemy alien, was permitted to come here by special arrangement of the sitate department. She went to Switzeriand last February with her hushand, who is still in Lucerne, and from there to Italy. She was met by her brother, Reglandid Vanderbilt, and her sister, Mrs. Harry Payne Whitney. It is her first visit here since the European war started.

"I am glad, oh, so. glad, to be back in the United States," ahe said. "During the war I stayed in Hungary. I don't want to discuss the war or what happened to me. 

Cork has probably passed olive oil as the leading export of Sardinia, and Commercial Attache A. P. Dennis states that recent production has been so stimulated that a large factory at Templo is quadrupling its capacity. The bark its stripped from the tree once in nine years. At the Templo factory the strick part is first throughly steamed and flattened out by hydralic pressure; it then remains in piles about 30 days, when it is taken out covered with blue mold, and is carefully scraped on both sides and cut inter widths varying according to the lengths of the cork stoppers desired. The strips are cut by hand into cubes, a process requiring blighly skilled labor, with much care in picking out defective pieces. The corks have been rounded and tapered by high-speed cutting machines, but a new, shraidy process is claimed to reduce the waste of this finishing from 20 to 30 per coat.
