DIPPING OF SHEEP IS OFFICIAL ORDER

State Animal Industry Authorities Attempting to Check the Spread of Scabies

Under terms of an order recently issued by J. D. Adams of the Idaho bureau of animal industry, and approved by Miles Cannon, commissioner of agriculture in this state, a quarantine has been established against sheep in Twin Falls county...

It has been determined that a disease known as sheep scabies exists among the sheep within Twin Falls county, Idaho, and a general dipping will be made of all the sheep within this territory...

Quarantining all territory within the confines of Twin Falls county. For the purpose of this order all sheep within this quarantined area are considered exposed to sheep scabies and shall be dipped once in a permitted dip according to the rules and regulations of this bureau...

The dipping of all sheep within this quarantined area shall be done as soon as can be arranged, in the period between this date and the first day of September, 1920. The two dips permitted by the statute and federal governments to be used for the dipping of scabby sheep or exposed sheep are, the lime and sulphur and nicotine dips.

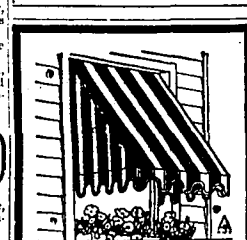

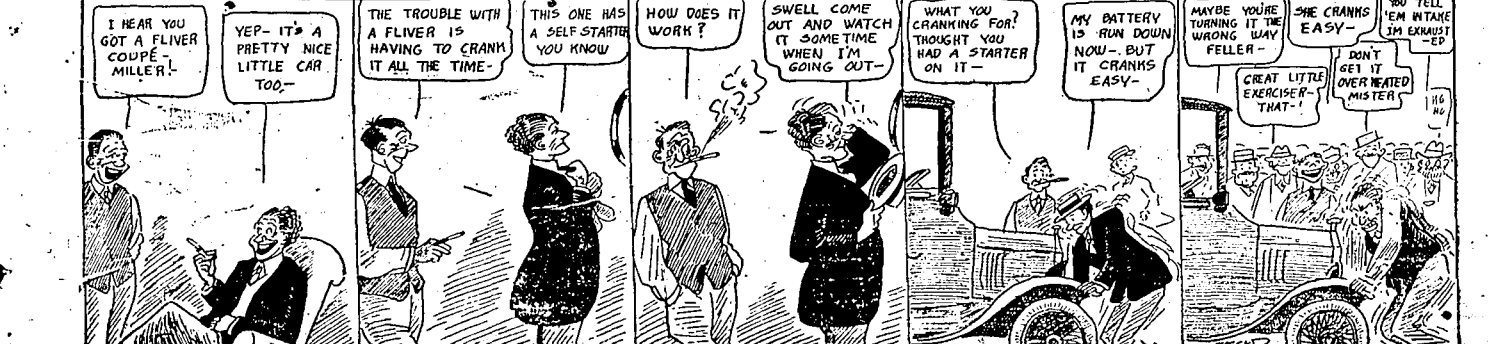
