Capitol at Washington Recognized A the Finest and Noblest Building on the Earth.

undations for the central struc Foundations for the central struc-ture of the present capitol in Washing-ton were finished on August 24, 1818. The old capitol had only two wings, connected by a covered wooden bridge, which was deterred and the wings damaged by the British, who set fire to the building in 1814. Three genrs de-ter congress voted to remore the wids-and build the user central structure, which with its dome was completed in 1820.

The two great marble extension riags in which the senate and house of representatives meet were bugn in 1850 and completed for eccupany in 1850. The old dome, made of wood and brick, was torn away in 1850, and the present dome completed in 1864. The great statue of the goddest of freedom, which reats upon the dome, was designed by Thomas Carwford, futiler of Marion Crawford, novellat. Charles Buildinch of Beston was the srchitect of the original central structure and Thomas II, Walter designed—the marble-extensions and the present capitod was about \$180,00,000 and it has been pronounced by architectural authorites, both in America and Europe, to be the greatest and uoblest building in the
