STUDEBAKER LIGHT SIX FIRST INTO YOSEMITE

Makes Trip from Coast Over Mountains and Snow Under Own Power

To a Studebaker Light Six has gone the honor of being the first car to enter the Yosemite Valley under its own power this year, over any one of the three roads from the Pacific Coast. The car, piloted by Hart L. Weaver, made the journey from San Francisco to the Yosemite National park in five days. Upon arrival of the car, Bill Weaver and others of the crew called upon George K. Towles, chief ranger of the Yosemite National park who pronounced a signal certificate declaring the Studebaker Light Six to be "the first automobile to enter the Yosemite National park under its own power, this year."

Light-Six is all the more noteworthy because of the honor that has been attached each year to the car which could first enter the Yosemite Valley from the Pacific coast. 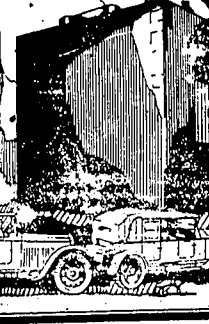

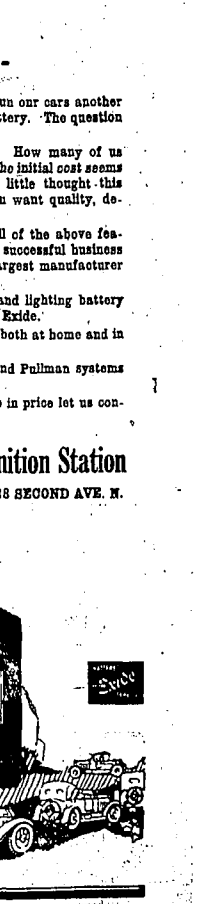
