DE VALERA RESIGNS PRESIDENCY OF IRISH REPUBLIC

BURCH FIGURES IN ATTEMPT TO CHEAT THE LAW

Man on Trial for Murder Declared by Jailer to Have Made Dramatic Attempt to Commit Suicide

DEFENDANT DECLARES INCIDENT ACCIDENT

Either Tried to Jump or Nearly Fell Through the Corridor Railing, Thirty Feet Above Steel Floor of Building

LOS ANGELES, Cal. (AP) — When Arthur Burch was taken from his cell at the county jail today to go to the courtroom where he is to be tried for the murder of J. Bolton Kennedy, he either slipped or tried to jump through the railing around 30 feet above the steel floor about 30 feet below.

A deputy sheriff was escorting Burch to the jail office when he slipped or fell through the railing. The officer said Burch deliberately tried to leap over the railing but was prevented by a grip on his arm. Burch said he stumbled.

Numerous prisoners who saw the occurrence expressed the belief that Burch had tried to leap. A fall such as was narrowly escaped would probably result in serious injury or death, jailers said.

Peter E. Peterson, a defense witness summoned today, Peterson had previously qualified as an expert on firearms and had related experiments made with the left barrel of the shot at various distances. Today he told of experimenting with the right barrel.

NATIONS ADOPT PIRACY RULE FOR SUBMARINES

Armament Conference Naval Committee Reaches Agreement on Proposal

WASHINGTON, D. C. (AP) — Consideration of submarine questions was concluded today by the five power naval committee with an agreement on a new code of conduct for submarines. The code, which is being prepared by the committee, will prohibit the use of poison gas in future wars. It was also agreed that submarines should be allowed to attack merchant ships, but that a decision would wait until tomorrow's meeting.

NEW TYPE OF CROSSING WILL SAVE MANY LIVES

Federal Aid Highway System Will Endorse to Minimize Railroad Accidents

WASHINGTON, D. C. (AP) — Grade crossings will be eliminated wherever possible and replaced with bridges or underpasses on all roads of the federal aid highway system to be constructed under the federal highway act, the bureau of public roads announced today. The bureau also announced that it is studying the feasibility of building half the cost of building the bridge or underpass.

INCREASED WAGE MAY CLOSE CHICAGO SHOWS

Operators Request for Base in Salary Will Not Be Considered by the Owners

CHICAGO, (AP) — Officials of the motion picture operators' union and members of the allied amusement association owners of the city, were to meet today for final decision in the battle over a 15 per cent wage increase. Owners of the theatres said they would close their houses on January 11, if the operators refuse to withdraw their demand for a 15 per cent wage increase. They asserted the operators are now getting from \$49.50 to \$9 a week, and that in many cases of the smaller houses they receive a larger portion of the receipts than the owners.

Man and Child are Wounded in Firing on Belfast Street

Disorders at Ulster Capital Continue Despite Extra Precautions

BELFAST, (AP) — Despite the increase in the number of military and police patrolling Belfast streets firing was renewed last night. A child and a man were wounded. A bomb was thrown, but did no damage. Rival mobs clashed in Dale street and in the center of the city in which stones and revolvers were used. The soldiers and police fired, dispersing the combatants.

FOOD RATIONS OF AMERICA TO SAVE MILLIONS

Twenty Million Dollar Grain Appropriation Expected to Preserve Lives of Enormous Numbers in Russia

MOSCOW, (AP) — William N. Harbo, director of the American relief administration work in Russia, returned to Russia from London yesterday, optimistic of helping to save, chiefly through American aid, 20,000,000 Russian lives. Harbo said that the grain appropriation, from five to ten million persons otherwise probably doomed to die of starvation in the Volga region.

I received a letter today making an engagement for 1922."

PROMPT ACTION AVERTS FIRE LOSS AT GARAGE

Use of Extirpating Quells Flames when Short Circuit Ignites Gas Used in Washing Motor

Prompt use of a fire extinguisher prevented damage to at least one late passenger car by fire at the Galt garage north at about 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Bruce Watson, a mechanic, was engaged in washing a motor with gasoline in the rear of the building when a short circuit caused the gasoline to burst into flames. The blaze was extinguished before the arrival of the fire department, which was summoned by another employee. The cars were parked in the immediate proximity of the blaze.

ENTIRE CABINET OF IRISH REPUBLIC FOLLOWS LEADER INTO PRIVATE LIFE

De Valera in Dramatic Speech Declares He Must Have Cabinet in Accord with His Own Views Together with Every Resource of the Country to Enable Him to Defend the Republic

EXECUTIVE AUTHORITY OF DAIL EIREAN DECLARED TO BE IRREVOCABLY SPLIT

Unexpected Action May Result in Acceptance of the Treaty Although Belief is Expressed that in Principle Opposing Factions Are as Wide Apart as Ever

DUBLIN, (AP) — Eamon de Valera resigned the presidency of the Irish republic today, presenting also to the Dail Eireann the resignation of the cabinet. He told the Dail he would offer himself for re-election standing on the principles of 1916. Mr. De Valera said he must have a cabinet which thought with him and he would demand that all resources be given him to defend the republic.

IRISH TREATY VOTE WILL BE HELD AT ONCE

Decision Reached to Settle the Question Immediately as to Acceptance by Dail of British Proffers of Peace

DUBLIN, (AP) — The affairs of the peace committee of the Dail Eireann to bring about an agreement on the Anglo-Irish treaty failed today, and the Dail will meet in private session this morning to discuss the treaty.

MEMBERS SEEM DEPRESSED

The Dail Members as they came from the chamber appeared depressed. One of them said the committee itself was divided this morning, although the success had been agreed on the plan which was submitted to the leaders of the opposing factions yesterday.

TRAINING IS MAIN NEED IN LABOR MARKET

Productivity of Workers Much Less Than Would Be the Case Under Proper System of Educational Effort

KANSAS CITY, Mo., (AP)—Labor is unfit in proportion as it is untrained. Miss Hazelle Moore, Des Moines, Iowa, declared in addressing the fifth annual convention of the National Society for Vocational Education in session here today.

"Authorities assert," said Miss Moore, "that 60 per cent of the workers in this country today produce half what they could if properly trained."

Miss Moore, in charge of employment as a welfare work at a hospital mill told of methods used in that establishment to fit the girl just entering employment in her job.

"The new girl," she said, "is made to feel she has a place in the plant by being personally introduced to the foreman and instructors. She is shown through the entire plant, and we see to it that she meets a few girls of her own age and knows their names before she takes her first meal in the plant cafeteria."

Refracting Men for Work.

"Salvaging men injured in industrial accidents instead of scrapping them," is the way Dr. St. Louis, Albany, N. Y., in charge of the section of the convention discussing industrial rehabilitation, described that work.

"We have learned," Mr. Little said, "that it is not enough to give a man such training or even pay him a few hundred or a few thousand dollars compensation following an accident. He must be refitted to earn a living at some new trade if he is incapacitated for his old one, before you have finished the job."

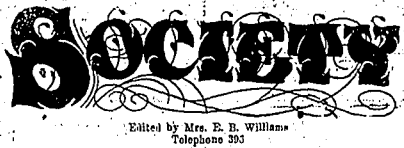
