

SANTA FE WILL DOUBLE TRACK ENTIRE SYSTEM

Thirty Million Dollars to be Spent in Improvements Between Chicago and Frisco, 2,542 Miles

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. (Special to The News).—Announcement is made by W. B. Storey, president of the Atchafalaya, Topeka & Santa Fe, that his railroad will double-track its main line from Chicago to San Francisco. This is the most welcome and significant statement that has come from a great railroad executive in several years. Most of the declarations of railroad chiefs as to the future have been pessimistic. This is highly optimistic.

Covers 2,542 Miles.

The distance traversed by the Atchafalaya in its course from Chicago to San Francisco is 2,542 miles. Part of this main line is double-tracked today, the principal section being that between Chicago and Newton, Kan., 630 miles. There are various other small portions of the road that are double-tracked, but there are perhaps 1,600 miles of new track to be constructed to complete the double tracking. The most expensive part of the work will be in the mountain districts between La Junta, Colo., and the Balcon Pass, where the road sweeps down into the valley of the Rio Grande and further west where the Atchafalaya crosses the Sierra Nevada range.

Will Cost \$30,000,000.

It would be modest to put the cost of the double-tracking of the main line at \$30,000,000.

Few railroads have been better managed and given better service to the public. Back in the nineties it was a financial wreck. For a time it was in receivership. Today it is a monument to the managerial genius of E. P. Ripley. Its earnings have been good through all the troublous years through the transportation companies have known in the last two decades. Its credit today is high. Its operation has been so good that long ago it earned the title of the Pennsylvania of the West.

Sees Prosperous Traffic.

The Atchafalaya's territory is not so good as that of some of its competitors yet it has prospered in both freight and passenger traffic and has branched out and absorbed other roads until today it ranks as one of the biggest transportation systems of the world. Where there is sufficient traffic to warrant double-tracking, a decided economy is effected. Evidently Storey and his associates are sufficient traffic for the Atchafalaya. Normally a box car is on the main line in gainful service on the American railroad only one hour out of eight throughout its life. The result on a double-track road is better, of course. Then on a single-track, there being less sidetracking, freight trains to clear the way for others.

The Harvey Service.

The Atchafalaya is remarkable in some ways. It commands a big share of the passenger traffic to the Pacific Northwest. In view of the influence of the Harvey outfit, eating houses and dining car service, yet never in the lifetime of Fred Harvey nor since his sons have managed the business has there been anything in the nature of a written contract between the railroad and the Harveys.

There is a lesson for all railroad executives in the success of the Harveys. A well-paid person is likely to bear the minor irritations of travel with complacency and not be critical or fault-finding. It is in the mother's suggestion to her daughter as to the way to retain a husband's love—feed the brute.

Dispels All Pessimism.

Biggest of all in the Atchafalaya announcement is the suggestion that it carries a brighter outlook for the railroads. If the Atchafalaya requires double-tracking from Chicago to the coast, it would appear that its competitors will require double-tracking likewise.

If the Atchafalaya sees increase of traffic, the others must see it also. There has been a disposition to believe the railroads are unable financially to expand to meet the needs of the nation's growth. Many of them are not today, or appear so, because there has been so much talk of poverty by the railroads.

Seattle plays a large part in every branch of business, even in financing railroads. The decision of the Atchafalaya lifts the pall of pessimism somewhat. It's about time.

TEST VALUE OF COAST DEFENSE

War Department Will Try Out Aircraft and Protective Armament

WASHINGTON, D. C. (AP)—Executive maneuvers to determine the military value of American coast defenses when operated in conjunction with modern aircraft for the coming summer are being planned by the war department. Under orders by Secretary Weeks, the order is now being prepared by the chief of coast artillery and army air service officials.

Although both branches are recognized as having an important role in coast defense, they have never been tested jointly nor has their personnel ever been trained in tests to coordinate coast defense work. It was expected that the tests would include three important phases of land and air warfare—aircraft target practice against air targets to determine the vertical range at which bombing planes could cooperate without being subjected to effective fire; bombing practice against coast defense installations to determine the effect of aircraft bombs on such targets and combined target practice at extreme range; and the relative value of bombing planes and large calibre coast artillery guns in operation against an enemy fleet.

Experiments already carried out between bombing planes and capital fighting ships are said to have given army officials valuable information on the relative value of those arms. Major General Cox, chief of coast artillery, and Major General Patrick, chief of the army air service, have been instructed to decide where the tests will be conducted. It is regarded as possible that they will be held on both the Atlantic and Pacific coasts.

Effect of Ease.

SALVAGE WRECK—CENTURIES OLD

Dutch Warship Sunk in Year 1641 Brought to Surface in Lerwick Harbor

LONDON, (AP)—Remnants of a wreck believed to date back to a Dutch-Spanish battle in 1641 have been brought to the surface by salvage workers in Lerwick harbor.

Four ancient cannon, each seven feet long with a three-inch bore, have been salvaged and these have been supplemented by massive oak timbers which are in a good state of preservation.

It is believed that the wreck is that of a Dutch warship which, with three East Indian men, was attacked by ten armed ships of Dunkirk (then Spanish), in Treasay Sound, on June 13, 1641. After a fierce engagement two of the Dutchmen were sunk and the third escaped, while the Dutch warship was compelled to surrender.

RETURNS INCREASE LEAD OF GOVERNOR McMASTER

South Dakota Republicans Seem to Have Renominated Executive Over Egan

SIoux FALLS, S. D., (AP) — With returns from yesterday's primary election coming in slowly, Governor W. H. McMaster's lead over George W. Egan, Governor-elect of Sioux Falls for the republican gubernatorial nomination is being gradually increased.

Latest returns from republican state headquarters at Huron show that with 612 precincts out of 1211 in the state reported, the governor's majority has reached 21,206. The vote stood: McMaster, 18,506; Egan, 27,100.

The contest for the republican gubernatorial nomination was the only question of statewide interest before the people yesterday, both in the democratic candidate, and Miss Alice Lorraine Daly, endorsed by the Non-Partisan league, being unopposed.

RUSSIA OFFERS WARE FOR SALE

Letter from Ural, Written by Hand, Encloses 5,000 Rubles Worth of Stamps

CHICAGO, (AP) — A hand-written letter, scratched with pen and ink on cheap news print paper and plastered with 5000 rubles worth of postage stamps, arrived at the headquarters of the Illinois Manufacturers' association from Ural, Russia, today with the first offer to export goods known to have been received here from that section of Russia.

The letter enumerated a sizeable list of goods, manufactured and raw materials which the national commissariat of foreign trade has for sale.

Merchandise included linen, copper, gold and platinum. Ties included manganese, malleable, tale, Jasper and various stones and a list of chemical goods contained caustic soda, emulsifier and silver for oil.

Some of the more unusual offerings mentioned were: urral stone handwork, mineral collections, spuma cardpy, hand-cast iron art goods, polished precious stones and shawls fabrications.

The letter was addressed from Ekaterinburg, where the former czar and his family are said to have been executed and their bodies thrown in the abandoned shaft of a mine, which was seized and has never been reopened.

WHEAT PRICE ADVANCE IS FOLLOWED BY SLUMP

Average During Early Trading is High or but Bear Activities Cause Sharp Reaction

Chicago Grain. CHICAGO, (AP) — Setbacks in the price of wheat took place near the end of today's session of the board of trade, the market being influenced to a considerable extent by optimistic reports about a probable big yield in Kansas this season.

Wheat averaged a little higher during the early trading, the chief factor being an upturn shown by final quotations at Liverpool. Besides, some authorities were predicting an improvement soon in export demands.

Corn and oats fluctuated in line with wheat. After opening unchanged to 3-8 higher, May 5-8, the corn market recovered some further gains.

Corn was under heavier selling pressure at the last and closed weak, at a shade to 1-4 to 3-8 cent decline, May 5-8 to 1-4 to 5-8.

Oats started a shade off to a like advance, July 3-8 to 1-4 to 3-4 and later showed a little more strength.

Lower quotations on hogs were reflected by the provision market.

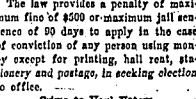

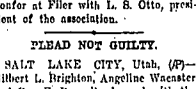
