BREAD SCARCE, MUSIC PLENTY

Russians, Lacking Food, Turn to Opera for Consolation and Forgetfulness

ODESSA, (AP) - Music, once the joy of the people of Russia, is now their consolation. They hunger for bread, and they long also for music to make their unhappy days more bearable.

In passing the unlighted streets of the cities of the lower Volga the stranger is often guided by piano music, burning upon the darkness. Walking at night, early morning through the streets of Astrakhan, the music and girls, often refugees, may be seen at the opera windows, at practice, thrumming on dilapidated pianos. At the dreary stations during the long winter people sigh. This kindly, talented people turn to music for comfort as they unconsciously as a distressed child to his mother.

Here in Odessa, by the Black Sea, there is and has been opera, good opera for several dreary years. The fields outside the city are bare, the cornfields are full and new ones give for more bodies each day. No home, no city, no war, no butterfly knows such sadness. The singers on the stage are hungry, so are the scene shifters, the musicians are hungry and so is the audience.

Yet each evening, through the darkness of the streets, they take their seats to the doors of the handsome opera house, thousands whose bodies are ragged with old clothes, whose stomachs are as empty as the fields, whose hearts yet respond to the magic of music.

The opera are sometimes those of Italy - "Tosca" and "La Traviata," but more often Russian. Pushkin, the famous poet, graced the city with his residence for many years, and so opera made from his stories are liked, "Mazepa," among others. One favorite is "Dubrovsky," the tragedy of a bandit, libretto by Pushkin, music

by Naprovski. This opera has a fine romance, a duet in the third act, when lovers sing and promise to be "always true, always the same." This refrain especially touches the audience. It remarks it by a set stiffness, rather than by tears.

"The opera over, the stupors and the mere back stage who humbly: the people file out like shadows through the gloom of the streets, the lights of the building drop away, the mist rolls from the sea, and darkness, not at all and the unburied possess Odessa again.

WARM WEATHER BOON TO CROPS

Long Hours of Bright Sunshine Makes Rapid Progress for the Crops

BOISE - Hot days, warm nights, and long hours of bright sunshine form a fine combination for growing wheat and where there was sufficient soil moisture all crops made rapid progress, according to the weekly summary of weather and crop conditions in Idaho, issued by Clinton F. Norment, meteorologist.

Irrigated crops did especially well. Dry farm crops, while not exactly suffering, would be greatly benefited by a good soaking rain. The deficiency in moisture is most pronounced in the panhandle counties and particularly in the lower Clearwater valley. All the cereal crops are growing nicely and alfalfa and pasture improving. Fruit prospects in the commercial districts are very promising. Strawberries are ripening and will soon be ready for market.

Notes From the Field. Fairfield, Columbia county: Bright and warm; ground drying fast; east end of the county in need of a good rain; crops practically all in. Pocatello, Bannock county: Sunshine 100 per cent; crops all planted except

a few potatoes; crops starting well; range improving. Blainville county: Good growing weather; all crops coming along fine; spraying for codling moth now on; large acreage planted to potatoes. Boise, Ada county: Weather during week was quite warm and all crops made rapid growth where irrigated; sun and air too hot for crops not irrigated; grass and alfalfa growing rapidly. Montpelier, Bear Lake county: Weather conditions during week very favorable except for a drying wind which carried away much soil moisture; seeding pretty well completed; crops looking well. New Meadows, Adams county: Excellent weather for growing crops; abundant sunshine and sufficient moisture; seeding of grain just finished; oats and barley coming up to good stand and very promising. Fruitland, Payette county: Most favorable week of season for all crops; fruiting well; strawberries beginning to ripen; cutting of first crop of alfalfa begun but crop poor on account of weevil; wheat in good condition. Caldwell, Canyon county: Splendid week for crop; warm day and night; corn and potatoes look well; alfalfa cut, none in blossom; prunes and other fruiting well; strawberries beginning to ripen, especially Delicious in this immediate vicinity; fruit spraying for codling moth mostly finished.

Little Crane, Blaine county: Range is in good condition and stock doing well. Burley, Cassia county: Except that two frosts during the week retarded potato growth, conditions were favorable for all crops; weather quite warm. Richfield, Lincoln county: Good

growing weather; irrigation of alfalfa about done; grain now receiving first irrigation; some corn and late grain still to be planted. Twin Falls, Twin Falls county: Ideal growing weather and all crops doing fine; planting beans and irrigating wheat are principal farm activities; early potatoes coming up nicely; calyx sprout about completed. Ocket, Cassia county: Plenty of sunshine; range and stock good; crops generally doing well; some beets failed and ground is being seeded for grain. Early potatoes coming up into potatoes and corn being planted. Aberdeen, Bligham county: Nights too cold for best growing weather but wheat, oats and barley are doing fine and alfalfa is growing rapidly; not all fruit buds killed by frost; potatoes coming up; ground drying out fast.

CASH REGISTERS MUST PAY DUTY SENATE DECIDES

Sewing Machines Also Removed From the Free List as Final Chapter in Two Day Fight Over Tariff Items

WASHINGTON, (AP) — After a two days' fight, the senate voted Thursday to remove sewing machines and cash registers from the tariff free list. Committee rates range from 25 per cent ad valorem to 40 per cent on these machines and 25 per cent on cash registers were approved.

The bill also limits the senate refusal to accept the committee rate of 30 per cent ad valorem on printing presses, lawn mowers and machine tools and adopted, to 27, an amendment by Senator Robinson, democratic, cutting that rate to 15 per cent. This was the fourth time the committee had been overruled in the six weeks the tariff bill has been under consideration. Seven republicans joined with the solid democratic minority in supporting the Robinson amendment.

MYSTERIOUS NOTE MAY OR MAY NOT HELP SOLUTION

Blackmail Murder Case Further Complicated by Discovery of Garage Workman

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., (AP)—Discovery of a note on the floor of a machine taken to a garage to be repaired on Thursday to lift the curtains of mystery surrounding the card party held in the New Rochelle home of Walter B. Ward, the night he shot and killed Clarence D. Peters.

At the same time the Westchester county grand jury, resuming its investigation of the case, after a day's session went into conference with District Attorney Weske over newspaper reports of its activities and the necessity for greater secrecy during the inquiry. When the case was adjourned until next Tuesday after examining five New Rochelle policemen, nothing could be learned regarding the nature of their testimony.

The note—the latest clue in the mystery which has been puzzling detectives since May 10—was returned over to the county authorities by Benjamin Franklin on Sunday in a White Plains garage. He said he found the letter, addressed to Mrs. Charles Dubois of Atlantic Highlands, N. J., in a car. According to "Frank" the note read in part: "Frank was there when it happened and left at 10:30. The glass that they found in the driveway was not from 'Ward's car as it is made from mine. Walt didn't arrive until 0:50 although Beryl was waiting."
