LLOYD GEORGE DECLARES WAR ON OPPONENTS

Former Premier Opens Campaign With Fighting Speech to Enthusiastic Meeting of Coalition Liberals

LONDON, Oct. 25 (AP)—Former Premier Lloyd George began his campaign in London today with a fighting speech to an enthusiastic meeting of the coalition liberal members of parliament, throwing down the gauntlet to the conservatives, who attack up to the late government, he declared, left no alternative but to "spread the war."

The little Welshman stood by his Manchester speech of October 14, reiterating his intention to support any party on government saving of peace, economy, and national progress, neither revolutionary nor reactionary.

New Chapter Opens
"We are confronted," said Mr. Lloyd George, "with a very important decision affecting not merely the future of those here and those who support them in the country, but a decision which affects the interests of the country itself. That is a more important matter for us all."

"One chapter in the history of the politics of this country is now being closed. A new one is opened. What is printed on that page will depend largely on the attitude we adopt." He counseled calmness and moderation and asserted the interests of the country must come first.

Discloses Resentment
"I have seen parties destroyed by personal resentments," continued the former premier. "I have seen parties rendered ineffectual by personal resentments. I have seen their judgment deflected, and for that reason they are not making the contribution they ought to the welfare of the people of whose property we are deeply concerned. We will not make that mistake, whatever happens. We will consider the first. Its interests must be deepest in our hearts; its interest must be highest in our consciences. Great Britain first; any party, even our own second and last."

For National Unity
"Now, that is our policy. We have stood for national unity, that is, unity of all men, all creeds, parties and sections for the purpose, first of all, of winning the war and afterwards extricating the country from its after-war difficulties."

VALUABLE FELLOWSHIP IS OFFERED BY AMHERST

Award Worth \$3,000 a Year Will Be Given Students Showing Ability in Social Science

AMHERST, Mass., Oct. 25 (AP)—An Amherst memorial fellowship yielding \$3,000 a year, to be devoted to the study of social, economic and political institutions, will be awarded next year, according to an announcement made by Professor Walton B. Hastings, secretary of the fellowship committee. Any college or university graduate is eligible for appointment. Eligibility for the award will be based upon evidence of marked mental ability in some branch of the social and economic sciences and history, and upon promise of original contribution to a particular field of study. Candidates will be preferred who are commensurate a spirit of service rather than ambition for personal advancement, including selection for life work of a study of the betterment of social conditions through teaching in its broad sense, journalism and field work.

There are 20 Amherst memorial fellowships available through the gift of \$100,000. Two years ago the first competition for places was held and 51 candidates representing all the leading educational institutions of the country participated. Three were selected, two for terms of one year each.

Applications for the new fellowship will be received until December 10, and the award will be made in January of the following year. The term of the scholarship begins on September 1, 1923, and the initial appointment will not be for more than two years, although it can later be extended.

HAT FOR WOMEN MOTORISTS IS PATENTED IN ENGLAND

PRINCE OF WALES GIVES NEW PHRASE TO GOLFERS

Hint to British Throne Establishes Another Bond of Sympathy With Countrymen

LONDON, Oct. 25 (AP)—The Prince of Wales established another great bond of sympathy with thousands of his countrymen recently when he hinted that the golf ball should be the "prince of the world." This happened at the latter part of September at St. Andrews as he was "playing himself in" as an expert of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club.

Today thousands of golfers at golf are rejoicing at the enrichment of the golf vocabulary by a phrase used on a course near London, shortly after the news had been received of the prince's ordeal at St. Andrews. A player scoffed his strict remark: "Ah! That was a Prince of Wales!"

This phrase is likely to be generally used in the future to refer to a golf ball of considerable amount of turf as well as the golf ball.

CUBAN REFORM WAVE RECEDES

Public Sentiment Leaves Investigation in \$45,000,000 Graft Charges High and Dry

HAVANA, Cuba, Oct. 25 (AP)—After threatening at one time to engulf the administration, the tidal wave of moral reform which raised its head when the contents of the famous Crowder memoranda became public last June, has begun to recede. The backwash has left the judicial investigations into various phases of the \$45,000,000 graft charges filed by Representative Bartolome Saguro high and dry, so far as public sentiment is concerned.

Excesses "Over the Judge"
Special Judge Augusto Saladrinas on whose shoulders fell the burden of formulating indictments in the more important cases, has reported several one of his most onerous charges that of probing into the alleged misadministration of lottery funds during the first year of the Zayas administration. "The Upright Judge," as he is popularly called, has been substituted by Francisco J. Argueta until the supreme court decides whether the investigation raised by the states attorney will prevent Saladrinas from continuing his duties.

The letter case attracted much attention when it first came before the public, especially in view of the fact that the great charge against the Zayas administration was that of a 50 per cent overcharge to the public for tickets.

Plenty of work remains for "The Upright Judge," however, in his attempt to have the real facts in the disappearance of \$100,000,000 in liberty bonds from the national treasury, and the great charge against the Havana municipal administration.

Pension Fund Missing

Similar investigations are being made by Special Judge Gabriel Valdames into the non-existence of \$9,000,000 of pension and other funds of the national treasury; the charges are extended to the federal general appropriations for public works, the treasury and sanitation departments, and two small cases in the department of communications. Judge Valdames's hearings have not aroused the comment that has marked his colleague's inquiry, principally because testimony has been offered that the missing funds were in the National bank when that institution closed its doors two years ago. One of the other cases has been halted through the services of Joaquin del Mazo, paymaster of the department of communications.

TOKIO, Oct. 25 (AP)—Toyoharu Morooka, a local philanthropist, has offered the government a tract of land in Fuyuhiko on which he proposes to build homes for 700 former beggars whom he has rescued from the streets of Tokio and other cities of Japan. Morooka has devoted his life to storing beggars to self-respecting and industrious citizens and he desires to found a colony where they can spend their declining years.

LIBERAL PARTY POLICIES GIVEN

Election Manifesto Repudiates Doctrine of Warfare Against Private Enterprise

LONDON, Oct. 25 (AP)—The election manifesto of the Independent Liberal party was issued Tuesday at a meeting presided over by former Premier H. H. Asquith. It declares that the coalition has broken up in general confusion and discord leaving behind it an unexampled record of extravagance and failure, and asserts that both wings of the coalition are responsible for its misdeeds and that neither can escape its share of public condemnation.

Liberalism is not socialism, says the manifesto. "Liberalism repudiates the doctrine of warfare against private enterprises. It stands for: "First, peace and disarmament secured through the league of nations."

"Second, prompt revision and settlement of reparations and international disputes."

"Third, drastic economy in public expenditures and abandonment of the policy of military adventures abroad."

"Fourth, fulfillment by the community of its responsibility for securing the workers against the hardships of unemployment; cooperation between capital and labor and honest and fair treatment of organized labor for the only basis of industrial peace."

"Fifth, unqualified free trade with the immediate repeal of the safeguarding of industries and similar protective measures."

"Sixth, maintenance of such essential social services as education, housing and public health."

"Seventh, comprehensive reform of the existing land system, including taxation and the rating of the land values."

"Eighth, democratic reform of the licensing system."

"Ninth, readjustment of the electoral system by the introduction of proportional representation."

RUSSIAN STUDENTS LIVE ON AMERICANS' RATIONS

Seller Administration Undertakes to Help Remedy Death of Professor at Man

PETROGRAD, Oct. 25 (AP)—Russian students to the number of 10,000 will be fed by American relief during the coming school year. They are to be fed at Moscow, Petersburg, Odessa, Kiev, Kharkov, and elsewhere.

There is a dearth of professional men throughout Russia at the present time and it is proposed to help remedy this deficiency by extending help to the classes which eventually will graduate and fill the vacant posts.

BROADEN SCOPE OF DENTAL TREATMENT FOR VETERANS

POCATELLO, Oct. 25 (AP)—War veterans of Pocatello who filed claims for dental disabilities due to war service before August 9 of this year or within a year after their discharge, are eligible for dental treatment at the expense of the government, even though the degree of disability is less than 10 per cent. J., Oct. 25 (AP)—A jury in Bergen county, headed by a 23-year-old girl, Aliss Susan Squires, today acquitted George Gilis, motion picture location finder, charged with murder, and also freed his brother-in-law, Charles Scullion, and Aliss Thornton, a friend, of charges of being implicated with him in the shooting to death of "Dave David" Jack Berger, motion picture actor, following a trial commencing here Thursday morning.

It was the first time in the history of judicial practice in New Jersey that a verdict in a murder trial was handed up by a woman. The evidence which resolved itself largely into a series of moral problems, was passed upon by a jury composed equally of men and women. And it was one of the most rapid trials ever held in a state noted for the rapidity of its judicial machinery.
