The record of Republican administration of Twin Falls county in the past four years show a reduction each year in the amount of tax money colnoted for county purposes.

This year the total of taxes for

county purposes will be \$97,000 less than last year's total.

The second is the establishment of the county's finances on a cash basis, so that this year, for the first time so that this year, for tao list time in its history, the county will pay no interest on outstanding warrants. The county's bill for interest on warrants in 1910 amounted to \$8,860.41. In 1920 it dropped to \$3,985.90. Last wear it amounted to \$383.75.

It is a noleworthy fact that while tinimment of the cash basis that attainment of the eash basis that makes possible the saving of all this charge has been in progress o county tax levy.
With a reduction of approximately

\$3,250,000 in the taxable valuation of the county, the county tax levy this year has been reduced from \$1.15 last year to ninety-five cents on each \$100

of valuation this year.

Out of thirty-eight counties in the state from which reports have been received, only seven have made tax levies this year that are lower than that of Twin Falls county. The worn counties with lower tax levies are either larger counters with greater property, valuation, or counties that on no outstanding ladebtedness of not maintain county hospitals and




