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UNITED STATES WILL SIT IN AT PEACE PARLEYS

America Will Send Observer to Near East Conference But Will Not Be Signatory to Treaty to be Evolved

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26 (AP)—The United States probably will be represented at the Near East peace conference by an official observer. There is virtually no chance that the Washington government will participate directly in the conference, however, or be a signatory of the treaty of peace to be evolved.

American Policy Unchanged.
Decision of allied governments to invite American participation as a party to the peace negotiations, it can be said on authority, finds the attitude of the Washington government unchanged. While the reply to the invitation can be formulated only after the invitation has been received, probably tomorrow, there is no reason to doubt what the nature of the American answer will be. The American policy of standing aloof from European political intrigues and confining itself strictly to questions in which it has a direct interest, commercial or otherwise such as the Turkish straits, has undergone a change.

Invited Through Embassies.
Paris dispatches indicate that the invitation is to be presented to Secretary Hughes through the British, French and Italian embassies in Washington. That it will be met with every courtesy, it is to be expected. At the same time, however, the embassies will be very fully advised that as a non-belligerent in the war between the allies and Turkey, the United States feels that it cannot have any direct share in a peace conference to bring that war to an end.

America Cannot Stand Aloof.
American interests are too deeply involved in the final solution of the problem of the Turkish straits, however, and also in the immediate Turkish American citizens shall enjoy in Turkish territory, both in commercial and religious matters, to permit the Washington government to stand wholly aloof from the peace parity.

HAPSBURG PROPERTIES BEING TURNED TO CASH

Benefits of Sale and Lease of Former Court Buildings to Go to War Invalids

VIENNA, Oct. 26 (AP)—The liquidation of the vast Hapsburg holdings in Austria with the exception of the possessions considered private, will be completed shortly, and the final report is expected to show the disposal of properties valued at many millions of crowns. Most of the funds realized through the sale and the leasing of former court buildings will be used for the benefit of war invalids.

The large reduction in territory now under the government of Austria has greatly diminished the amount of space required for administration purposes, and many blocks of office buildings have been rented to private individuals.

The possessions considered as private have been reduced to the minimum. Many personal presents made to former Emperor Francis Joseph, Emperor Elizabeth, and the late Emperor Karl by foreign monarchs, Austrian cities and communities, were included in the sale. A large number of costly vases, clocks, pictures, and other objects sold to foreigners, particularly Italians, who paid large amounts for their purchases.

The old and new court palaces, the court stables, and a number of famous castles, villas and estates in the provinces were, the principal buildings sold.

CANADIAN BOAT AGAIN FISHERMAN'S CHAMPION

Blunstone Scores Second Success in Third Official Race Against Challenger

GLOUCESTER, Mass., Oct. 25 (AP)—The schooner Blunstone of Canada, is again champion of the international fishing fleet. Captain August Walden and his fellow Lunenburgers yesterday scored a second success against the Henry Ford, American challenger, and Captain Clayton Morrissey and his crew of Gloucestermen. The margin was one of seven minutes, 11 seconds, about the same as the Blunstone lead of yesterday. While the Gloucester boat in fact won two races, the first was declared unofficial because of recurring bluffs. In his place, Captain Al Mallock, one of Gloucester's hardest drivers, had the wheel much of the time.

Today's was another smashing contest. 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NATURALIZED AMERICANS IN RUSSIA COUNTED LOST

Bolshoi Administration Counting Efforts to Assist United States Citizens to Get Home

MOSCOW, Oct. 26 (AP)—Scattered about Moscow are about 40 "lost" persons whose relatives claim for them American citizenship, and for whom search is being made by representatives of the American Relief Administration.

Since the A. R. A. entered Russia a year ago, all one of the conditions being that all American citizens who desired to leave the country should be permitted to do so. 214 persons who had established their American citizenship have left, most of them, for the United States. Late in September there were about 100 other persons awaiting completion of the necessary repatriation operations. In many cases these require weeks, and often months, owing to the various technical matters connected with passport requirements.
