

GERDING ADOPTS GERMANS' VIEW ON INDEMNITIES

Former British Cabinet Member Declares Reparations Cannot Be Collected Because Money Is Lacking

LONDON Nov. 11 (AP)—Sir Eric Gerdin did some very plain talking about German reparations as the guest of the Thirty club of London recently. This club is an association of advertising experts. When asked if Sir Eric could not collect his right-of-way because of speed, and since he became a fast-time man again, he is more outspoken than ever.

"In 1918 I was a politician," he said. "Now I am a businessman, and we should not make foolish mistakes. That is what we might find. Reparations, a boomerang, and that the demanding of great sums from Germany might be bad. I nearly lost my seat over that statement, and I do not regret it."

He added that the necessity of doing any bargaining between the Allies had been continued. "What I said in 1918 has come absolutely true now," he declared. "We were absolutely wrong as allies. In trying to get the last pound out of Germany, we cannot get a cent."

"It is no use chasing a cent. We can only get reparations out of Germany by either money or goods. We do not have money, and if you take her gold it will just unemploy her."

The leading thought coming out of the meeting was that the world would be better off if Germany could get something for this country.

"I have just come from Germany. They are desperate there. There will never be a giving government unless the people know that they can manage their affairs. We must give Germany some way to broaden her field so that Germany can pay and tell them that there will be no improvement. When we do that Germany will try to pay, if possible. But you cannot exact payment of several millions for reparations."

ENGLISH WOMEN ADVISED TO TAKE UP PIPE-SMOKING

Physician Urges Feminine Advice to Cigarette to Use Good Tobacco Instead

LONDON Nov. 11 (AP)—English physicians are urging women to give up smoking instead of smoking and chewing tobacco. The doctors' paper—*the Lancet*—said the round in the cheaper brands of cigarettes is more injurious than that the "perfume" old ladies used in brands prepared for the fair and also are injurious.

Two recent deaths of women have been attributed directly to cigarette smoking. While the death of one woman was due to smoking the other, the physicians say that the same amount of smoking probably would not have had fatal results.

Smoking among women in London is now almost universal, and one rarely sees a woman in dress, coat or restaurant where the making of women's voices are not smoking.

Recently two young women appeared at an athletic meet smoking pipes, and many of the healthful slopes of Bond street have exhibited signs of pipe smoke. The physicians' advice is to quit. However, the physicians' message may be ignored, and cigarettes are still popular.

WOMEN PREDICT EASY TO TALK

LONDON Nov. 11 (AP)—Many women fully intended to talk politics, and to be ready to participate in a coming general election.

A well-known woman scientist who has been teaching members of parliament and journalists met yesterday to discuss the political situation.

CROPS AND TAXES

The statement has been made, and

the fact has been established that the tax per acre upon farm land in Twin Falls County during the present year amounted to the sum of five dollars per acre. In some cases the tax was more than this, in others less.

Assuming a wheat yield of fifty bushels to the acre upon these farm lands, the tax expressed in terms of freight charges upon wheat being shipped out of the length and breadth of Southern Idaho which is not susceptible of this amount with approximately or stronger results.

The farmer can't draw the load. He got by when the freight rate was approximately half what it is today—he can't get by now.

Frank Gooding was right when he said that unless the farmer of Southern Idaho prepares the taxes of Southern Idaho cannot. He might have put it stronger still. He would have been fully justified in concluding that the present freight rates out of Idaho towns are in effect for just another year. No Southern Idaho won't pay a cent more for the privilege of shipping out of the state, nor the reason that same result is enough to satisfy a factor of existence.

SAFETY FIRST PAWS

The railroad safety movement has

warred of late years for safety, and

it has proved to be an asset in another

way than in conserving human life.

The movement has proved to be a way

to get money to the roads which have

supported it.

On one list, the cost of maintaining

the safety department came under

\$12,000 per year. The reduction in

compensations for injuries, since the adoption of the safety measures amounted to \$164,000 for the same length of time. The cost of accident charges made on the road in the cause of safety, would probably not exceed \$60,000. It has been estimated that with this sum taken as a generous allowance for safety measures, even an experience has proved, the railroad would receive a yearly profit of 2½ per cent.

The saving of human life is the

first consideration, of course. But,

even that may be counted in terms of

dollars and cents, and a needless waste

of life means loss of money. Preventive measures are relatively inexpensive. This is a lesson which all organizations having to do with activities pertaining to life and health are learning. Safety pays. The money spent in its pursuit is not wasted, but stands rather for an insurance of the corporation's equipment.
