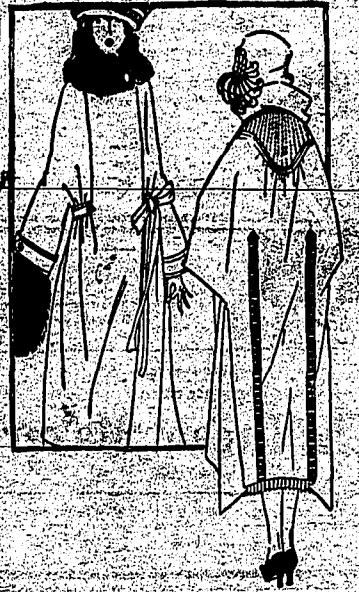

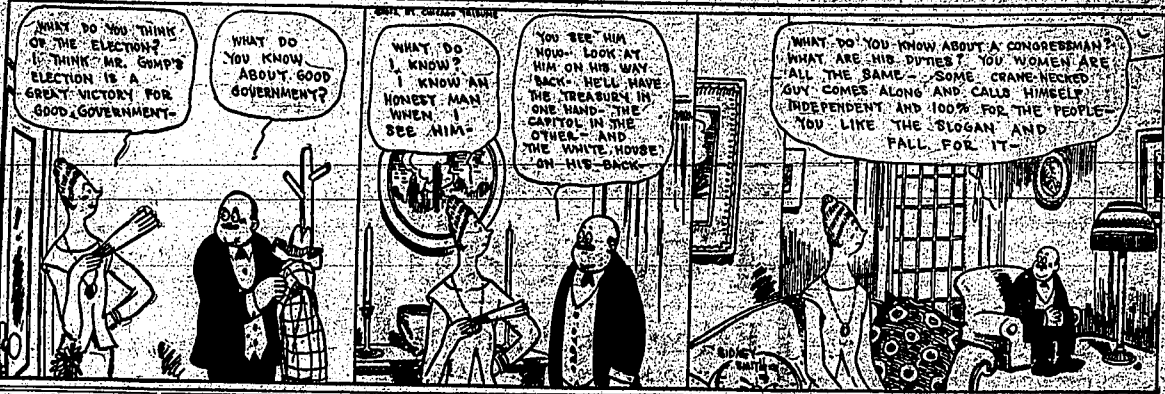

Plan to Form Policy for State Department at Meeting in December

The state department of agriculture has issued a call for a convention of farmers, fruit growers, dairymen and poultrymen to be held at Boise, Idaho, on December 10, 11 and 12. The purpose of the convention is to discuss agricultural problems and to take such concerted action as may be deemed proper and advisable to the promotion of the industry.

Gov. McGowan will open the convention with an address on 'Agricultural Policies for Idaho.' His address will be followed by a general discussion of existing conditions and the presentation of resolutions designed to increase the farmers' income.
