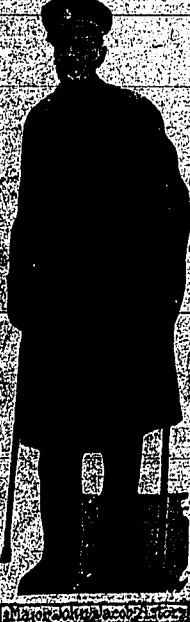

Strong Protest Is Entered Against Orchard's Release

Local Man Calls Attention to Circumstances of Conviction of Idaho's Foremost Criminal and Gives Reasons in Opposition to Granting of Pardon to Slayer of Governor Steuenberg

Twin Falls, Nov. 16, 1932.

Dear Sir: Boise, Idaho.

I notice in the morning press that a petition has been made to the pardon board for the release of Harry Orchard. I feel that it is my duty as a citizen of this state to give you my views on the subject.

Like yourself, and every other citizen of this state who has witnessed the trial of the Governor Steuenberg's assassin, I cannot forget the debt of gratitude that we owe him for his chief executive at a time when lawlessness reigned in the midst of north Idaho, and his courage, sturdiness and tenacity for fair play and good government made this a better state in which to live.

I am at a loss to see how he can now make the same threat to the pardon board.

VENEZELOS WILL TAKE NO PART IN GREEK POLITICS

Former Premier Says If Elected to Parliament He Will Resign, People Given Choice of Monarchy or Republic

LONDON, Nov. 16 (AP)—Eleuterios Venizelos, former premier of Greece, and head of the Greek delegation which will attend the Near East Peace Conference at Lausanne, declared today in an interview, he has given for several months and also expressed several phases of the Near East situation as he sees it.

The role of King Constantine, he added, "is to keep the Greek monarchy to the role, not to take any part in the Greek government, but to remain a neutral, free, independent monarch."

Asked if he had any comment to make on the passing of Lloyd George, or the British Near East policy in the future, he said he had no comment to make on the situation of Italy in retaking the ten Dodecanese Islands, which she once promised to Greece.
