# UNDERTAKES TO MAKE FORECAST FOR STOCKMEN

### Government's New Reporting Service Seeks to Prevent Gluts and Shortages with Attending Price Variations

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17. (AP)—A new livestock reporting service for forecasting current livestock production marketable supplies and commodity movements has been organized by the department of agriculture. The service will cover the corn belt and the western range states and will function through state establishments already connected with the department's estimate work. The co-operation of many railroads, stockyards, packing plants and producers' organizations for furnishing data as a basis for forecasting has been obtained.

The new service is part of the department's program for collecting and disseminating statistical information on agriculture, in an effort to influence the organization of the farm business on a sound economic basis. It is believed that the new service will aid in the prospective livestock production and information of current market movements will enable purchasers better to correlate supply with demand, thereby protecting fluctuations in price.

### Current Wild Ranges

The current reports are proposed to be made at least once a month. The reports on changes in numbers of livestock on farms, estimated pig of fresh meat, 1,000,000 pounds of poultry, on farms, and November, 1922, 600,000 pounds of sugar, 100,000 pounds of corn, 100,000 pounds of wheat, 100,000 pounds of alfalfa and 500,000 gallons of milk and cream and western states, monthly reports are estimated yearly by the bureau showing pasture and feed conditions in various states. The condition of livestock expressed in percentages of normal, and livestock prices on the range in territory distant from markets. The monthly reports on "cattle on feed" will be made in February, 1923, and monthly February 1st of each year, the estimates to be confined to animals where cattle are fed. Estimates will be made of the wild range lamb crop in the range states, the first report to be made in January with final revision on January 1 of each year. Plans for making similar estimates in the corn belt states will be shown in the monthly reports. The estimate of the prospective supply of hogs for spring and fall delivery will be made in February and August.

### Regional Statistics

Other reports will be an estimate of the prospective movement of grass-fed cattle from southern Texas, in February, an estimate of the lamb crop of California and the early lamb crop of Texas, Idaho and Colorado, in March; a report on the condition of pasture in Kansas, Utah, Hills and short grass areas in March and April; an estimate of the prospective movement of grass-fed sheep from western Texas, in March; the grass feed cattle movement from California, in May; the number of cattle which have come from the southern states to Oklahoma, Kansas and other northern pastures, in June, the probable number of calves and feeder lambs available for shipment from Arizona, Idaho, Wyoming, Colorado and New Mexico during July and August; the number of grass-fed cattle moving to market from Kansas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Wyoming, in July; and a report of the calf crop of Texas, New Mexico and Arizona, in September.

### SEAGULLS HAVE WING

**SPREAD OF SEVEN FEET**  
BURLINGTON, Vermont, Nov. 17. (AP)—The spring gulls of Lake Champlain, the birds' "carnival," have passed this fall's first observation year, during which this species' long wings were given protection on the four hundred islands which they inhabit because of their usefulness as scavengers and outlet of the city sewer in the lake.

The species of gull seen here is said to have been found farther south than Albany, N. Y. The islands were first visited by Edward Hensley, New York, a half century ago for the purpose of protecting the birds, and the Hensley family ever since then has maintained a station to protect the steady lay of eggs and killing of gulls. The average full grown gull here measures between five and seven feet from tip to tip.

The bird's shrill cries assist in locating poachers. When the male gull is nesting he is visited, the male gull will attack the intruder with its wings, which can deal a powerful blow. Scientists say that one of the gulls which come to the islands annually is more than eighty years old.

A force of about 1,500 employees is required to prepare and serve the 674,000 meals which railroad waiters annually serve. The sales of diners are traveling forty and fifty miles an hour.

These meals are prepared in dining cars which have a floor area of 100,000 square feet, 10-18 feet long and 3-8 feet wide, each kitchen having four cooks, a chef and three assistants. Each car represents an investment of \$20,000, of which \$5,000 is spent for silverware, glassware and linen.

### OREGON WOULD INTERVENE

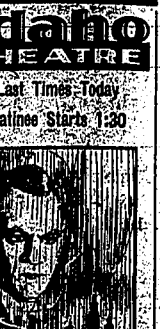

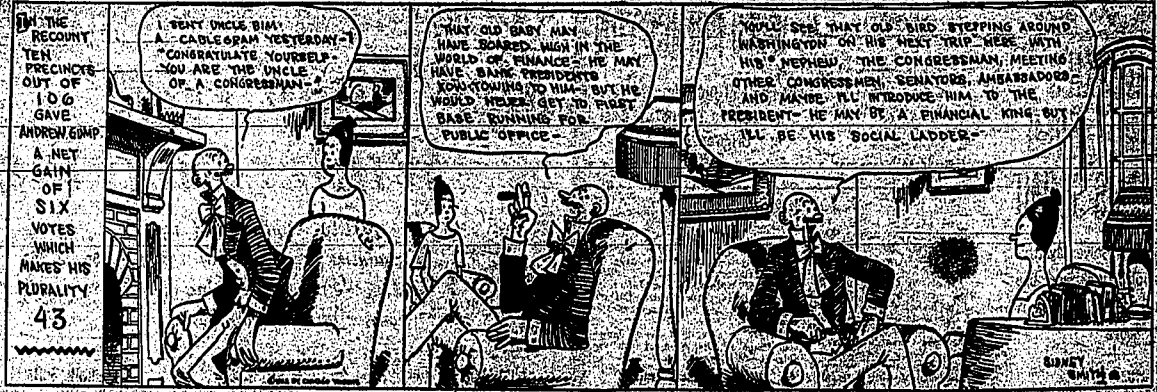
