LABOR BOARD'S POWER TESTED

Supreme Court Announces Purpose to Review Case Involving Jurisdiction in Strikes

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—The future activities of the United States railroad labor board, particularly the scope of its jurisdiction in the settlement of impending railroad labor strikes, will be dependent upon the decision of the supreme court in a case brought by the Pennsylvania railroad company, which the court announced today it would review.

Board Wins and Loses.
Winning in the United States district court at Chicago in its challenge of the authority of the labor board to enforce and enforce railroad officials to confer with delegates from labor unions as representatives in their contracts in the settlement of rules and working conditions, the Pennsylvania railroad lost in the seventh circuit court of appeals to which the government had appealed. The latter court held that the board having fixed wages, later could take up the subject of rules and regulations which had been made in the contract. That the railroad labor board was without authority to nullify contracts it had entered into with its employees, which were null and void as to the labor to both employer and employee.

Government Opposes Review.
Review of the case by the supreme court was opposed by the government on the ground that the appropriate strike only of which the controversy arises is that of Chicago. The filing of the application by the railroad company for the review of the case, which was filed on the ground that the board had the power to set the supreme court within the time allowed by law.
The government, granted by the district court, was in its favor, notwithstanding the reversal of the decision on points of law by the circuit court. But the supreme court has not yet actually determined the Pennsylvania Railroad company and all its employees of every class from the jurisdiction of the labor board.

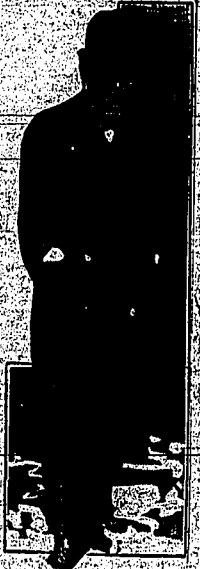
Order Proceedings are Prepared in Chicago, Chicago, Ill.

MEXICAN GOVERNMENT SEEN IMPROVED (DOUBT) PROBABLY

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 20 (AP)—The "amparo" as a legal recourse in Mexico is to be restricted in a bill which the government intends to present to congress. Abuse of the measure is the reason, President Obregon recently declared, that so many lawless persons arrested have already provided themselves with an "amparo" which secures their immediate release without bail.
The "amparo" is one of the most generally used and at the same time the most complex procedures to be found in Mexican courts. It is a sort of injunction and habeas corpus combined, and is employed either to restrain a court from acting or to secure the release of a prisoner from custody. Attorneys here admit that an exact definition of the word is impossible, and point to the fact that books have

been written about it, with its specific meaning and origin still obscure.

Prisoners, Given Jail Sentences, Declared Police Failed to Return Money

Officers that police officers failed to return money belonging to Jess Carillo and Joe Jump after their arrest on charges of having liquor in their possession, and the two men were released when they were given an opportunity to make statements after their conviction in district court yesterday. Each was fined \$100 and sentenced to serve 30 days in jail.

Walter Elger pleaded guilty to a liquor charge and was fined \$100 and given 30 days in jail. Mrs. Elger pleaded guilty to a statutory charge and the case was set for November 27. Mr. Elger is to appear for arraignment on a liquor charge.
