# SEEKS HARMONY OF MINORITIES IN LEGISLATURE

## Idaho Democratic Chairman, in Letter to Progressives' Leader, Proposes 60-Days Working Agreement

BOISE, Nov. 25.—(Special to The News.)—A sixty days working agreement between democratic and progressive members of the legislature for the purpose of carrying out the pledges contained in both progressive and democratic platforms, is the suggestion made by Will H. Hornbrook, chairman of the democratic state central committee, in a letter mailed today to Frank B. Johnson, progressive state chairman. The proposed agreement, would cover only pledges on which both party platforms are in complete accord.

Mr. Hornbrook says in his letter, "I am going to take the liberty to suggest that the chairman of the progressive state central committee and the chairman of the democratic state central committee appoint a committee of four members from each party who will be commissioned to confer and draft tentative bills. The legislation upon which both parties thoroughly agree, in their platform declarations, I would further suggest that this committee draft bills which are to be the basis for the form and substance of these bills prior to the date the legislature convenes. The bills thus drafted would be of course by the committee and suggestive, but they would provide a basis for an agreement and united action in carrying into effect the promises made by the parties which they have been commissioned to represent."



### HARVARD HUMBLING YALE WITH SMASHING VICTORY

#### Clash of Crimson and Blue Takes High Rank as Soccer Spectacle in Classics

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Nov. 25.—(Special to The News.)—Harvard defeated Yale today, 10 to 3, in a game which in reputation, play and in scenic spectacle, took high rank in the long line of these annual contests.

Queen, initiative and Crimson resources overcome the big Blue team with George Owen, Harvard's burly back, operating as individual hero. It was Owen's run-back of a Yale punt 47 yards through a fighting Yale team that led directly to his touchdown and his succeeding point by kick in the first period.

#### Scores on Both Advances

A tactical survey of the game shows that Harvard scored on each of its real advances into Yale territory. The score survey shows that Yale five times drove fairly deep into the Crimson area, yet scored only once. As in other games this season, the Blue players

## ARMY DEFEATS NAVY IN HARD FOUGHT CONTEST

### Cadets Play True to Season's Form and Win Over Midshipmen by 17 to 14 Score

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 25.—(Special to The News.)—The Army and Navy football teams met today in a hard fought contest, the Army winning by the score of 17 to 14. In one of the hardest and closest gridiron games ever seen, the Pennsylvania field in a long time.

The score represented two touchdowns and a field goal for the Army and two touchdowns and a field goal for the Navy. The midshipmen were not without honor in defeat, for they played a game that was worthy of any team that has come out of Annapolis in years. Entering the game with the West Pointers as favorites, the Annapolis crew fought their way to the front and they were met after a most bitter struggle, with their colors flying.

#### Army Fights Back

The Army, unopposed by the unexpected field goal, kicked hard. It had a pass thrown the Navy back for a big loss and the midshipmen were forced to kick. Then they made a short run that put the Navy in kicking distance and Garbaths booted a place-kick goal over the bar for the Army's first score against the Navy since 1916.

#### Game Was Witnessed by 71,000 People

The game was witnessed by 71,000 people at the Fair Ground. From the few who were nonpartisans, George Clemenceau, war premier of France, came the expression that was probably representative of the opinion of all who saw the game. "Splendid sport," he said.

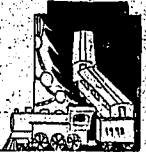

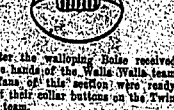

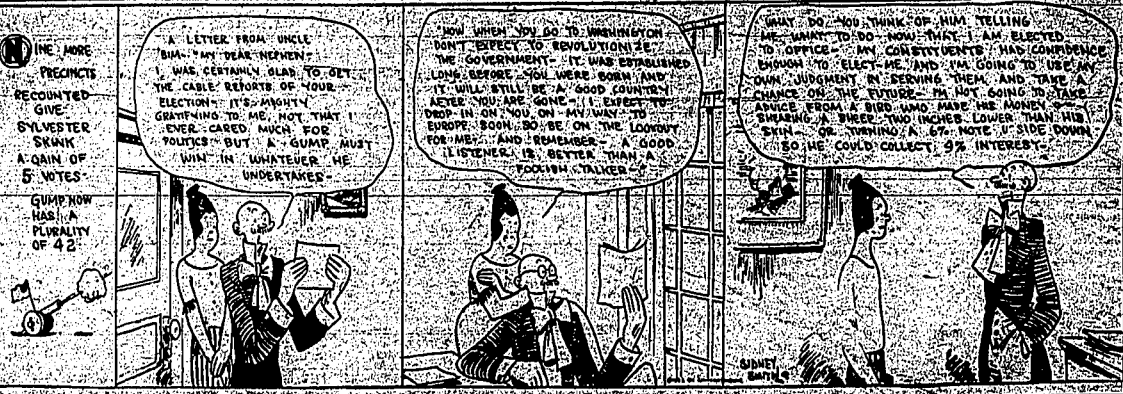
