House Appropriations Chairman Calls Bill's Figures Misleading and Insincere

WASHINGTON, July 6.—(Special Correspondence.)—In a manifestly insincere and misleading presentation of figures, Chairman Hull of the democratic national committee, has undertaken to refute some of the claims of President Harding for credit to the republican party for the reduction of the national debt.

Mr. Hull's assertion that the reduction of approximately \$4,100,000,000 that has taken place in the national debt since August 31, 1919, \$2,550,000,000 was paid off by the democratic administration.

Mr. Hull's contention is that the democratic administration paid off that amount of debt during the 18 months prior to March 4, 1921.

Mr. Hull is once more insincere when he makes reference to "the republican industrial panic of 1921." The industrial panic to which he refers began in the middle of 1920.

PORT WORTH, Texas, July 6. (AP)—The federal grand jury returned indictments against 17 oil promoters today, making a total of 104 oil men to be indicted since the government began its oil fraud probe last October.

The oil fraud indictments followed others which have been returned. They set out that the defendants devised a scheme and artifice to defraud, quoting the literature and asserting that in truth and fact, the promoters knew that the statements were untrue.

One Suspect Gains Release and Search Turns to Colored Man Who Boatied Freight Following Crime

SYRACUSE, N. Y., July 6. (AP)—After the release late today of James Clark, a negro, arrested on suspicion of being the murderer of Dorothy Kaufman, young girl, who was brutally slain Tuesday night in the home of Magistrate Craighead, police again turned their attention to searching for a negro said to have jumped aboard a Buffalo freight passing through the yards here.

Finger prints have been made from the handle of the knife with which the girl was stabbed to death while alone in the Craighead house, and from a cracker box said to have been dropped by the murderer in vaulting a fence.

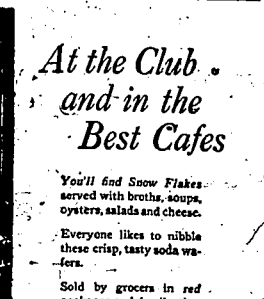
Presiding Judge Seeks by Questions to Obtain Full View of Issues Raised

The end-to-end type of this aerial consists of a number of lengths of No. 14 standard copper wire, strung parallel to each other, and attached to the uprights at each end of the attic by means of ordinary aerial insulators.

United States' Milk Supply Is Best in World

Application of Knowledge of Sanitary Methods Ours Own Epidemics

WASHINGTON, July 6, (Special correspondence)—The old-fashioned milk-peddling outfit, with its unsanitary open milk can and dipper has disappeared from the city streets of the United States.

The milk we drink today is free from bacteria, which cause disease than ever before, and the decrease in epidemics which can be traced to milk supply bears clear evidence that the application of our knowledge of sanitary methods of producing and handling milk for human consumption has been successful...

Inspection Effective Factor

Our milk supply is much safer than that of foreign countries because of three outstanding reasons. First, our system of inspection is the most exact and rigidly enforced.

Development of proper pasteurization is a second important factor. The term "pasteurization" originated from the experiments of Louis Pasteur in France.

Foreigners Study Method

The great amount of bottled milk in the United States is a third reason for the superiority of our milk supply over that of foreign countries.
