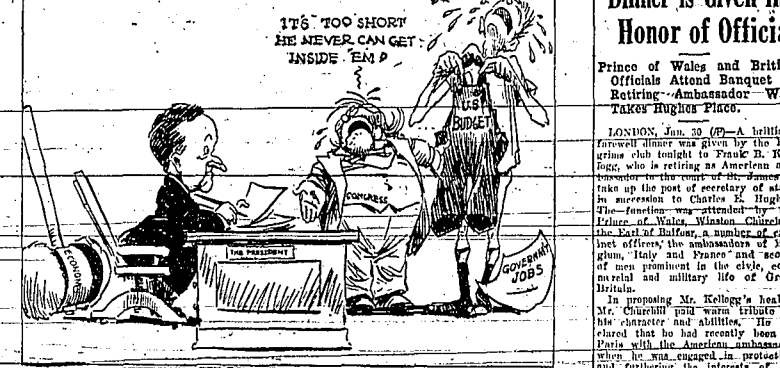

Federal of Cattle and Sheep on National Forests to Remain at Same Price as Last Year, Gore Announces.

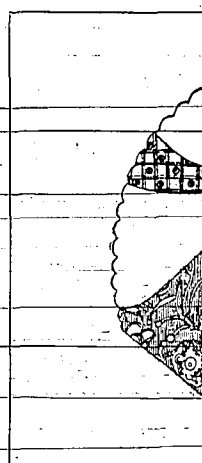
