

NATION WEAK IN AIR-POWER HOUSE HEARS

Aircraft Committee Calls on Secretaries of War and Navy for Explanation How America Could Be Protected.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16 (AP)—A report by testimony from officers of both the army and navy that the United States is deficient in air power, the house aircraft committee today called upon Secretaries Weeks and Clegg to send representatives before it to show how the war and navy departments could adequately defend the nation against an attack from the air.

Although committee members were not willing to discuss the matter, it is understood the nation to call upon the department for confidential information as to the military air department's present status. Representative Perkins, republican, New Jersey, the committee chairman, it was intimated, does not believe the war and navy departments are able to utilize the funds of some members that the military department is not able to utilize the funds of some members of the navy department. Perkins said that the committee will take up the matter of going more extensively into the question of government ownership of the national defense in all of its phases in the coming week.

Conflicting Statements Members revealed that many conflicting statements had been made to the committee about the country's air power and that some witnesses had asserted that the country's air department is in a state of confusion. Brigadier General Mitchell, assistant army-aircraft, has told the committee that the United States ranks fifth in the air arm, behind Great Britain, which could be defeated at present because of the deficiency in the air service. The announcement that the war and navy departments had been called for confidential aircraft information at the close of the day after the committee had heard several witnesses.

One Aircraft Report Brigadier General Price, chief of the chemical warfare service, testified that gas attacks in the next war would be "fifty times more important" than in the last and pictured raids that would be made by gas. He said that the next war would be a "war of attrition" and that the committee should be prepared to meet it. Frank H. Goff, a captain in the chemical warfare service, another witness, asserted that Secretary Weeks had to busy "writing Bible brown bear stories for the newspapers" to obtain all the facts on the value of chemicals in warfare. Captain Martin of the Marine Aircraft company attacked actions of Howard Egan and Colonel E. B. Terry, as he recalled the aircraft production line found during the war.

RAILROAD HEADS REFUSE TO MEET UNIONS, CHARGE

Executives Do Not Want Peace With Labor Organizations, Declare Officials; Bill Side-Tracked

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16 (AP)—Charging the railroad presidents with refusing to join in conference looking for a method of establishing industrial peace, the sub-committee of chief executive officers of railway labor organizations made public tonight a report on the progress and status of the Howard-Barkley bill, designed to provide means of settling railroad labor disputes.

Refuse to Confer

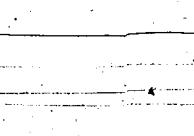

CONGRESS ACTS TO GET RID OF BELLS PENDING

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16 (AP)—Both the house and senate speed forward today in an effort to clear their calendars before a night session.

Several of important bills which developed in the senate last week was dispatched today to the house.

Republican leaders said the unanimous consent agreement with reference to the retirement bill would not interfere with the calling up on Wednesday of the House bill.

Kellogg of Minnesota, to be secretary of state after March 1, and also received from the interstate commerce committee a favorable report on the nomination of William E. Humphrey, a former member of congress from Washington, to be a member of the federal trade commission.
