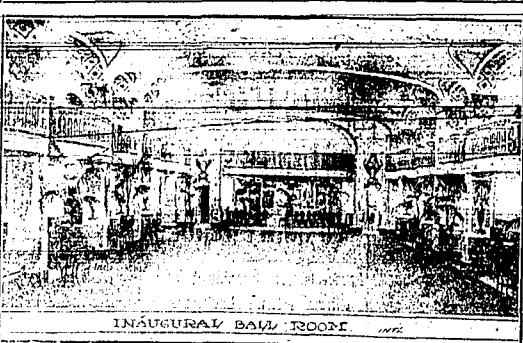

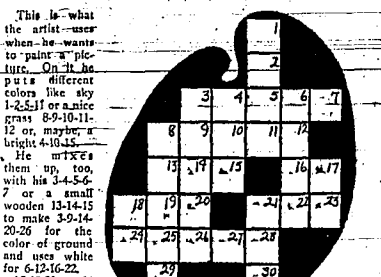

Five of Voting

District Trustees, at Public Meeting, Give Reasons for Asking Approval of Levy for Coming Year.

Twin Falls independent school district, in order to meet the demands of anticipated increase in population and tuition which have resulted on the present standard, must be provided with approximately \$500,000 more than will be available for the coming year. The additional levy of 20 cents per \$100 of valuation is the additional amount which the district trustees request to meet this deficit.

Attention to this effect was made by F. H. B. Brown, superintendent of Twin Falls schools, at a public meeting held Monday evening in the high school auditorium with less than 20 electors of the district in attendance. Most attendance was attributed by G. M.
