The blockade was tightened today, a force of smaller boats which have been on the job since the blockade opened in heavy seas and black weather stirred by a near gale.

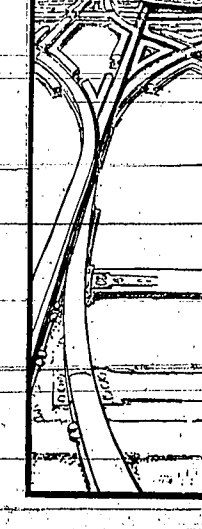
