HIGHER TIPS IN BOOTLEG RINGS LOSE HEAVILY

Effect of War Against Rum Runners Hits American Bootlegger With Big Money Invested; Results Are Evident.

NEW YORK, May 8 (AP)—American bootleggers in the highlands of the international whiskey trade are the big losers as a result of the war against rum.

The most general opinion reported that the capture of a number of operators of rum boats between the two islands in the past few months has had a serious effect on the business.

Members of the local force on the blockade returned to their States in the early part of the week and had been recently reported that the rum business was breaking up. All the boats that were seen in the area were there today, they said, in addition to four new ones which arrived yesterday.

Count guard officials said the blockade had been tight since the beginning of the year and that the number of boats in violation of the law is the lowest since the beginning of the year.

DES MOINES, Ia., May 8 (AP)—Chief of Police James Cavanaugh today reported that he would carry into effect his plan to educate the public as to the true status of the bootlegger by the parade system.

He said that he would continue rounding up automobiles wrecked in alleged drunken parties with appropriate signs condemning the liquor and bootlegging trade. The signs would prominently display the name of the bootlegger who sold the automobile with signs such as "bootlegger's private car."

WHEAT CROP TO SHOW REDUCTION

Thinks Winter Plantings Will Return Smaller Amount of Breadstuff.

WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—A winter wheat crop almost one quarter smaller than last year's production is forecast today by the department of agriculture, which placed the total at 1,482,000,000 bushels.

More than one-fifth the acreage sown last fall was abandoned because of late winter killing the largely late-planted crop. The acreage abandoned was 1,954,000 acres, which is 1.3 per cent of the total area.

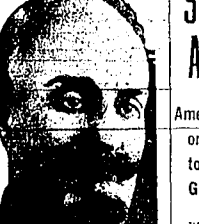

AMERICAN ASSOCIATION DECIDES ON COMPLETE INVESTIGATION INTO ALL PLANS OF AIR TRAVEL FOR GOOD OF COUNTRY.

PHILADELPHIA, May 8 (AP)—The American Association of Aeronautics today voted to undertake what was described as the most thorough investigation of the entire aircraft situation ever made in this country. All aspects of the industry will be taken up by a special committee. The task is expected to require one year and cost between \$50,000 and \$100,000.

The action of the administrative board followed the adoption of the report of the council's aeronautics committee which Prof. Joseph W. Howell of the Department of Industrial Engineering in New York university, is chairman. Pointing out that the industry is in a state of confusion, a national program, both as to preparation and general development, the report stated that "the uncertainty in conditions there also was great danger to investors."

Should Not Ignore War In a discussion over the question whether the preparatory factor should be emphasized in the inquiry, Dr. H. E. Howe of Washington, D. C., said that the report should not be ignored. He added that Japan and Germany were working closely together in developing their air forces.

Appointment Charles C. Mann of Boston was appointed to represent the committee in aiding the war department's preparatory plan as they relate to construction.

The resignation of Randolph P. Miller, New York, as the council's representative to represent the other national associations, effective August 1, was accepted. Mr. Miller, in a report to the council, stated that he would like to trade union disputes in the building industry were rapidly being eliminated as a result of the "national board" of the war department.

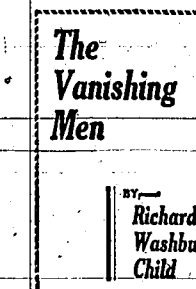
