Germany Reiterates Entire Willingness to Meet Dawes Plan

Exhaustive Survey of Foreign Relations Includes Renewed Promise to Live Up to Agreements.

BERLIN, May 18 (AP)—Gustav Stresemann, foreign minister, in the course of an exhaustive survey of Germany's foreign relations, presented to the Reichstag today, made emphatic reiteration of the German government's intention to carry out the provisions of the Dawes reparations program.

Her Stresemann made cordial reference to American interest and financial co-operation in Germany's economic recovery. He believed that "even those who are inclined to entertain serious misgivings about the practicability of the Dawes plan," he continued, "must now admit that without it we could not have achieved the national recovery we have."

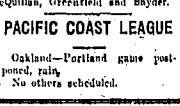

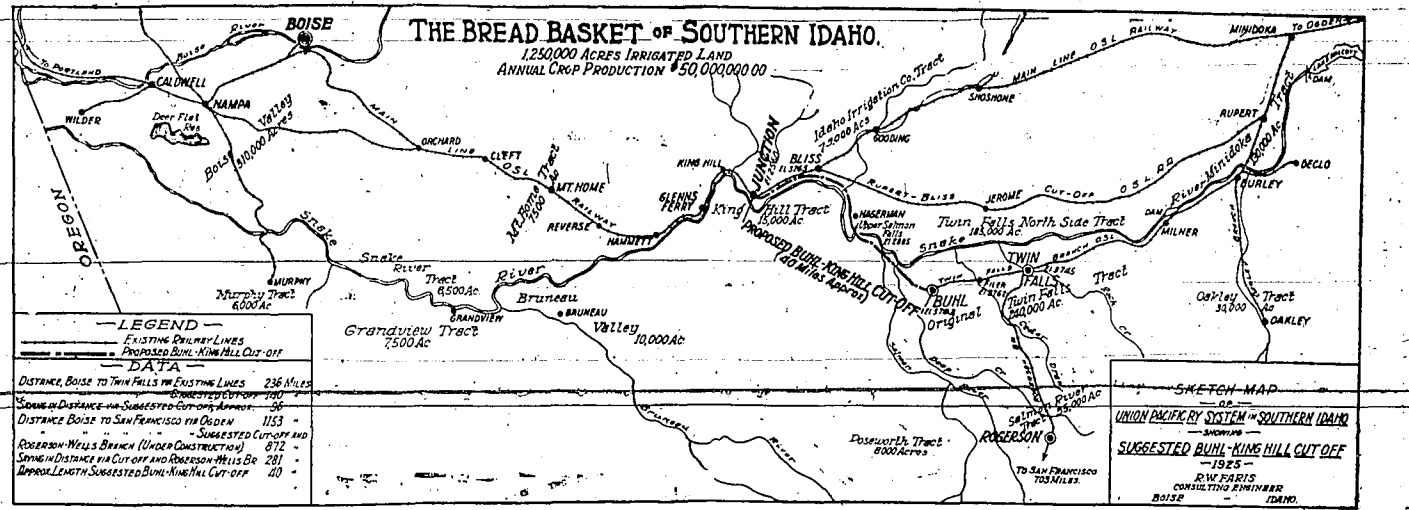

BOISE ENGINEER OUTLINES NEED AND FEASIBILITY OF PROJECT TO SUBVENT CAPITAL WITH PACIFIC COAST BY ROBERTSON-WELLS LINE

Boise and look for relief from inadequate and insufficient facilities to local improvement of existing lines and the construction of branch lines and cut-offs, wherever found desirable and feasible.

A careful study and survey of the situation, as it now exists, would suggest as the most promising and definite prospect of immediate relief from the burdensome conditions existing with reference to transportation facilities would be in the construction of a cutoff line from some point on the main line of the Union Pacific, in the vicinity of King Hill, Idaho, to a junction with the Twin Falls branch of the system, as a connecting link between the main line and the Robertson-Wells cutoff which would, in fact, make it a real "main line" from this "bread basket" to Sun Prairie, which already has been and always will be our natural outlet and supply point.

Shown on the accompanying map, the construction of a short cutoff line, about 40 miles in

length, designated on the map as "PROPOSED BUILDING HILL CUTOFF," in addition to the saving of 20 to 25 miles effected by the construction of the main line through Boise, would further reduce the railway mileage from Boise to Twin Falls to 100 miles, and from Twin Falls to Sun Prairie, via the Robertson-Wells cutoff, proportionately making a total saving of distance of more than 300 miles, or nearly 30 per cent, due to the construction of this proposed cutoff, the main line through Boise and the Robertson-Wells cutoff.

The route for such a cutoff is entirely feasible, an any new grade, as the situation shown on the map indicates, and at a moderate cost. In addition to the saving in mileage, shown on the accompanying map the construction of this line would eliminate the King Hill grade, of something like 1.75 per cent, over the great obstacle in the operation of that portion of the line between the junction of the main line and the Robertson-Wells cutoff, a distance of about 30 miles, and the grade of the line, with the excessive King Hill grade eliminated, in favor of continued traffic to the Pacific coast, via the Robertson-Wells cutoff.

Under existing conditions, this section of Idaho

will be handicapped in its efforts to reach the markets of the Pacific coast via the Robertson-Wells cutoff, on account of the long "back-haul" over the main line, through Minidoka to Twin Falls, whereas the upper Snake river valley will have a direct outlet to the important markets of products, with which we are forced to compete.

The construction of the "PROPOSED BUILDING HILL CUTOFF" would relieve us of the disadvantage of the "back-haul," shorten the distance to the Twin Falls country nearly a hundred miles, enabling us, as a distributing point, to extend our trade territory to that extent, on which account the entire territory lying west of the proposed cutoff and Boise, in particular, is interested in its construction.

The people of the Twin Falls country are widely awake and appreciative of the benefits that would accrue from the construction of such a line and are actively engaged in its promotion. In view of past experience and the long patient of the Twin Falls country, it would seem that the time was ripe and that it was "up to us," to join with our neighbors in the southeast, to promote and boost this improvement, to make it a "Quarterly of Events" that will bring still greater happiness and prosperity to our state.

RUM ROW WILL SOON DISAPPEAR

Number of Bootlegging Craft Along Dead Line Is Steadily Shrinking.

NEW YORK, May 18 (AP)—Rum row on the Yorks, has dwindled to seven ships, in capitalization to the little vessels of United States coast guard which started its famous mid-Atlantic rum row hunt.

This information was sent by wireless today from the blockading fleet commander, Commander Stephen R. Yeadle, aide to Rear Admiral Billard, commandant of the coast guard.

Yeadle, on Saturday completed a four day observation and inspection cruise of the scene of the country's first raid against the bootlegging industry. On that cruise, during which a group of newspaper men made an investigation of the results of the blockade, it was found that the rum fleet had dwindled to a discouraged twelve.

The day the blockade started, May 7, there were about eighty foreign rum carriers at anchor in the Atlantic between Narragansett, R. I., and Atlantic City, N. J.

Five of the ships the newspaper men found weighed anchor and slipped out of the blockade zone during Saturday and Sunday, Yeadle was informed by the officers in charge of the coast guard offensive.

Commander Yeadle said dispatches from the bootlegging fleet had reported that the boat to shore run runners—the "bottle fishermen"—had not renewed attempts to get in communication with the "rumrunners" as the guardmen term the contraband catfish.
