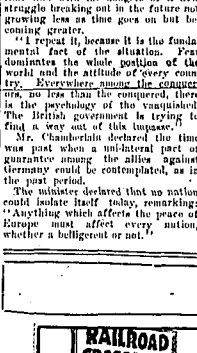

FLYING FEATURE OF CELEBRATION

American Falls Committee Arranging for Aerial Manuevers at Jubilee at Dam Site.

POCATELLO, June 24.—With the assistance of Senator Frank H. Gooding and Congressman Addison T. Smith, the committee in charge of the American Falls dam celebration, headed by Judge H. H. Hays of this city, is preparing to assemble an unusual number of army and perhaps mail airplanes to give demonstrations as part of the jubilee on July 13. Although the date conflicts with those for the beginning of another army aerial maneuvers at Cheyenne, an effort is being made to bring them off. It is hoped the army aviation authorities will consent to a spin from Cheyenne to American Falls as part of this year's maneuvers, which involve twelve flights of considerable distance from the base.

The army flying with private aviation features, will be merged into a unique combination of air and water for the occasion.

Agast Lewis and Clark

The pageant for the American Falls celebration, as planned, will present a history-making spectacle. Old Fort Hall is to be re-erected, and in line will appear "Leeds" and "Circus," "Barnum" and other interesting features. The jubilee will include a parade, the whole trimmed with elegant parties, the usual expressions of "thanks" and "thanks" and other activities will also be in line. Half a dozen bands will furnish music for the pageant and during the day.

The committee also is preparing to participate in the parade in a most distinctive fashion.

Flight of the "Dam Eagle"

To further advertise the celebration "The Dam Eagle" will make a flight the entire length of the Snake river valley. Ashton to Welter, bombing the town with fireworks. "Meet the fire" at American Falls July 13.

Hubbard Steeley, reserve officer, will pilot the ship, which will carry an average fifty members of the "drop" association, which is cooperating with the American Falls jubilee.

The eagle will make the round trip from Bonanza to Ashton on July 2, at its present schedule. On the third day the bombardiers will hang off from this city to Boise, making a stop at Twin Falls. On the fourth the air-razer will fly from Boise to Welter, then to Nampa, for a stop at the fourth of July celebration, and will here that afternoon. "The Steeley" tendered his services. The committee pays for the gas.

Included in the features now arranged for the celebration are July 3, an elaborate daylight fireworks display, one of the largest ever shot in the northwest. It is stated an unusually large carnival, with numerous shows, a "Bible" "Fun House," special airplane stunts, baseball and other sports.

The formal ceremony of laying the cornerstone of the great dam will be held in the forenoon, preceding the opening of the jubilee. Secretary of the Interior Work will officiate. A massive stone will be lifted from the bed of Snake river by one of the huge cranes now in operation on the dam. Later will be featured by a "cove" tablet suitably engraved.

Secretary Work will speak later from the same platform with an Indian chief who, in full tribal regalia, will talk briefly in his native tongue.

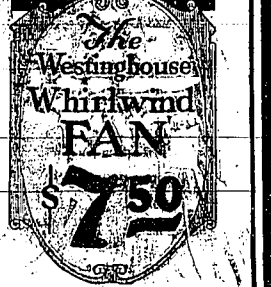

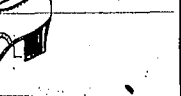
