SENATOR URGES
HALF BILLION
CUT IN TAXESUNITED STATES NAVAL
FLEET LEAVES HAWAII
ON AUSTRALIAN TRIP

HONOLULU, July 1 (AP)—Halfway to Hawaii, the United States fleet stopped on its voyage to Australia.

The "battle" began under the most favorable conditions, even though the winds, according to "smileys," were "awfully" sound from ship to ship of the fleet. Today was a perfect Hawaiian day, brilliant sunshines, no fog, no clouds.

By 10 o'clock this morning Admiral Robert E. Cooley had "gathered his chickens together" outside Honolulu and the ships were all in position. The sun was given, and the prows of the entire fleet turned southward. Army and navy airplanes appeared aloft for a last demonstration of their "aunts" while the naval gunners, who had been hidden spots on the horizon, and then were gone.

To eliminate what he described as "gross" evasion under the graduated taxation of corporations, he suggested imposition of a normal tax upon the net annual earnings of all corporations, regardless of what part might be held by individuals.

He could see no advantage to be derived from a conference of state and federal officials to consider overhauling and dual taxes, which has been proposed by the Senate Finance Committee.

He thought the states should meet to formulate a plan to eliminate dual taxation among themselves.

It has been customary, sheriff Finch
stated, to lock prisoners for the night
in cages between 7 and 10 o'clock, and

SOUNDS APPEAL FOR REVIVAL OF AMERICAN IDEAL

Dr. G. W. Dyer of Vanderbilt University in Address Here, Challenges Encroachment on Self-Reliance.

A gathering of about 100 persons, including delegations from towns and communities throughout the country, Dr. G. W. Dyer, dean of the department of economics of Vanderbilt University, Nashville, met in Twin Falls city park Wednesday evening, delivered a powerful appeal for individual liberty and responsibility as an essential principle of the American form of government against encroachment of bonds of socialism that he believed constitute a dangerous threat to American ideals.

Immediately preceding his address in the park, Dr. Dyer attended and spoke before a meeting of the Rotary club at which Twin Falls mayor and councilmen, local business leaders and some club invited guests, emphasizing in their address the increasing difficulty with which American business and industry are operated due to hindering laws, regulations, governmental restrictions and urging governmental regulation and upholding the demands in political affairs.

On Motion of Twin Falls City Council, who is returning from the Pacific coast on the return of a nation-wide speaking tour under auspices of the National Industrial Council, was brought to town through the courtesy of the Chamber of Commerce.

Alexander in connection with the meeting in the park included several numbers by Mrs. O. P. Duvall and Mrs. W. Z. Smith with piano accompaniment played by Miss Alice Adler.

Characterizing the constitution of the United States as "more than a great political document," Dr. Dyer said, "it is a great spiritual constitution, the expression of an ideal life extending to all phases of living including religion, education, and industrial and social life, and setting forth principles of individualism, protection of individual liberty and individual responsibility."

"The fight is on," he declared, "between America, the individual, and society, on the one hand, and socialism, communism or that seeks to change the American form of government with a view to taking care of folks."

American ideals and their products are being threatened, he said, "in the struggle that once its strength and power is lost it's strength in the necessities to which it is put for survival. Socialism and communism are threatening to dominate the world, far which every convenience is provided by nature with the result that it is difficult to determine whether an oyster is a fish or a bird."
