

POSSE CAPTURES TWO PRISONERS IN FARM HOUSE

Youths Who Dug Their Way Out of County Jail Surrounded Near Kimberly and Taken; Third Man Still at Large.

In a two-room farm dwelling, about four miles south of Kimberly a posse composed of deputy sheriffs and police officers captured two out of the three prisoners who escaped Tuesday evening from Twin Falls county jail.

WALSH ATTACKS DOHNEY STAND ON OIL LEASES

Statements of Magnate If True Places Some Degree of Responsibility on Entire Harding Cabinet, Declares Senator.

NEW YORK, July 2 (AP)—Edward L. Dohney's recent statement on the naval reserves, if true, places some degree of responsibility for the "voluntary cessation" upon every member of the Harding cabinet, Senator Walsh said today.

"Mr. Dohney asserts that the subject of the executive order transferring the control of the oil reserves from the navy department to the interior department, was discussed in at least two cabinet meetings, at which Secretary of the Navy, Charles D. Mays, would have to have the transfer made," the senator said.

"According to my recollection," Senator Hughes and Secretary Hoover at least, were asked if the subject was ever considered at a cabinet meeting. Both replied that it was not, or at least that neither of them had any recollection of such an event. It will be recalled that Secretary Mays was never the subject in view of the Dohney statement. The statement, if true, involves even the cabinet members in some measure of responsibility for the oil transfer.
