Members of the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association have here advised that W. E. Thomas, state game warden, will be in Twin Falls today and tomorrow and has expressed his desire to meet with the association members and members of the county's legislative delegation to consider the possibility of discussing the protection of sage hens in this county.

Each state game laws provide for an open season on such birds, but members of the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association are endeavoring to be in favor of declaring an closed season this year to provide protection and bring about increase in the flock of birds that have suffered heavily during the past several years. The association also has been advised that there is available for shipment to this district within the next few days a large number of hawk trout from the Hagerman and Big Spur. These trout are to be used to stock streams in the vicinity of Three Creeks.

## FRENCH BUDGET FORGED THROUGH

Government Now Has Three Months Freedom to Attend Other Affairs of State.

PARIS, July 14 (AP)—France finally has a budget and the government has about three months' freedom from parliamentary bother in which to speed up the Moroccan war, evacuate the Ruhr, negotiate a peace settlement and discuss a peace pact with Germany. Premier Painleve and Finance Minister Caillaux had the budget voted by threatening to resign. They forced through the three billion franc budget, with a balance of 15,000,000 francs on the right side of the ledger. But Senator Bergeret reminded them that three very certain treasury revenues carried outside the budget that must be included in the 1925 document, which M. Caillaux introduced. The session from just as this year's budget was adopted. The present budget lacked 15 days of being before the parliament for a full year.
