SCOPE FILES APPEAL NOTICE

Verdict of 'Guilty' Returned Against Tennessee Educator as Result of Evolution Trial; Goes to Higher Court.

(By The Associated Press) DAYTON, Tenn., July 21 (AP)—The trial of John T. Scopes on a charge of teaching evolution in a public school...

After both defense and state counsel had agreed this morning that the defendant should be convicted, the jury returned a verdict in less than ten minutes.

The defense then moved for a new trial and when this was overruled Scopes' attorneys made a motion for summary judgment to complete the record and send the case on its way to the supreme court.

The beginning of the end of the case that has covered a wide variety of subjects was reached when the court convened this morning. Attorneys on the confounding side of the issue, announced they would not appear to present and submit the case on appeal to the jury.

Mr. Scopes could not stand upon any plea that would be heard before the supreme court.

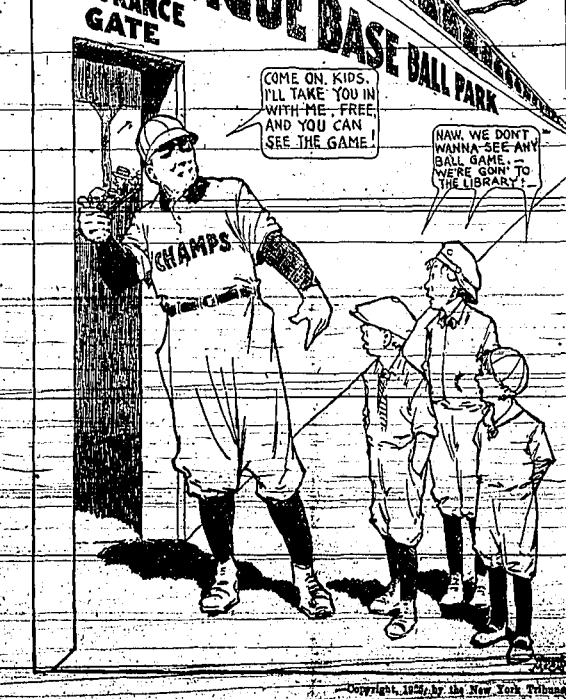

Twin Falls was battered and drenched by one of the most terrific storms in its history early Tuesday afternoon when heavy rain and hail accompanied by high wind swept over a wide area.

Under the combined attack of wind, rain and hail in Twin Falls many trees were uprooted, scores of windows, including two or three large ones, were broken, and many houses were flooded as rising torrents flowed through the streets.

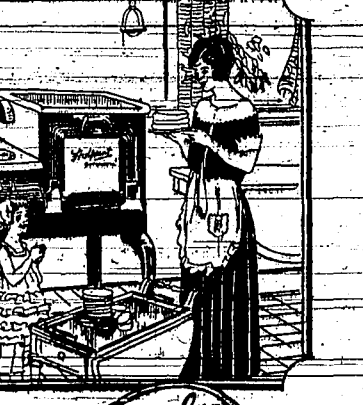

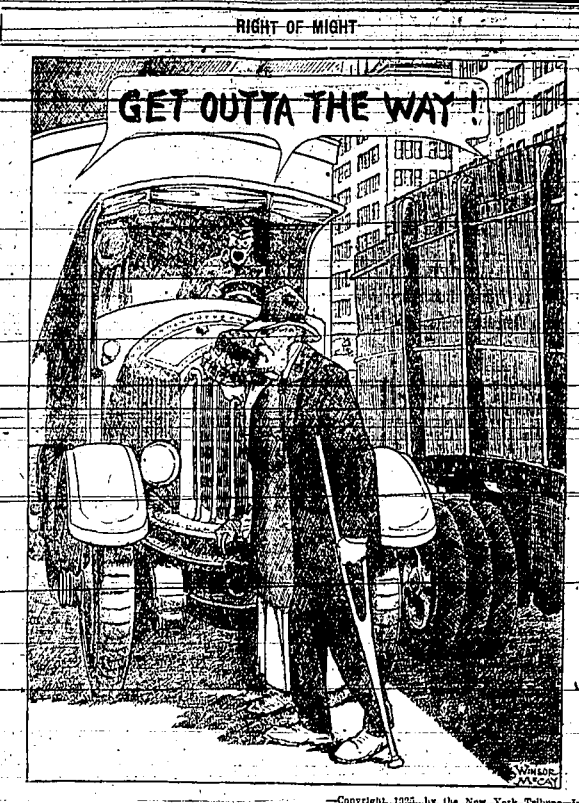

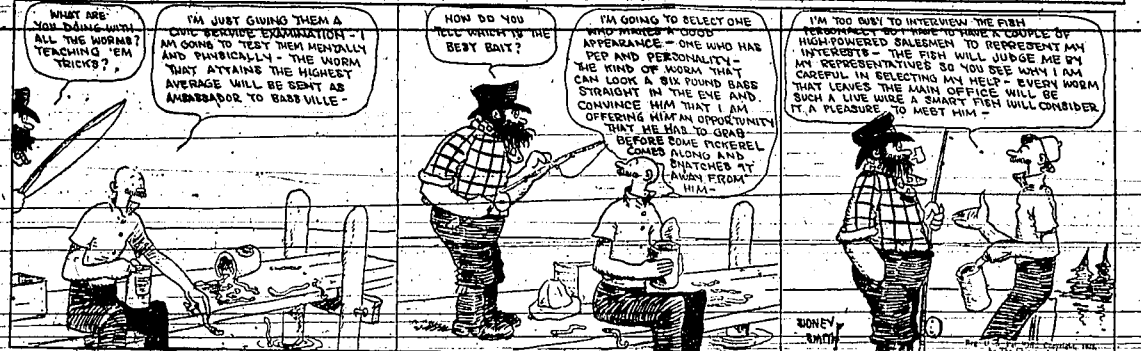
