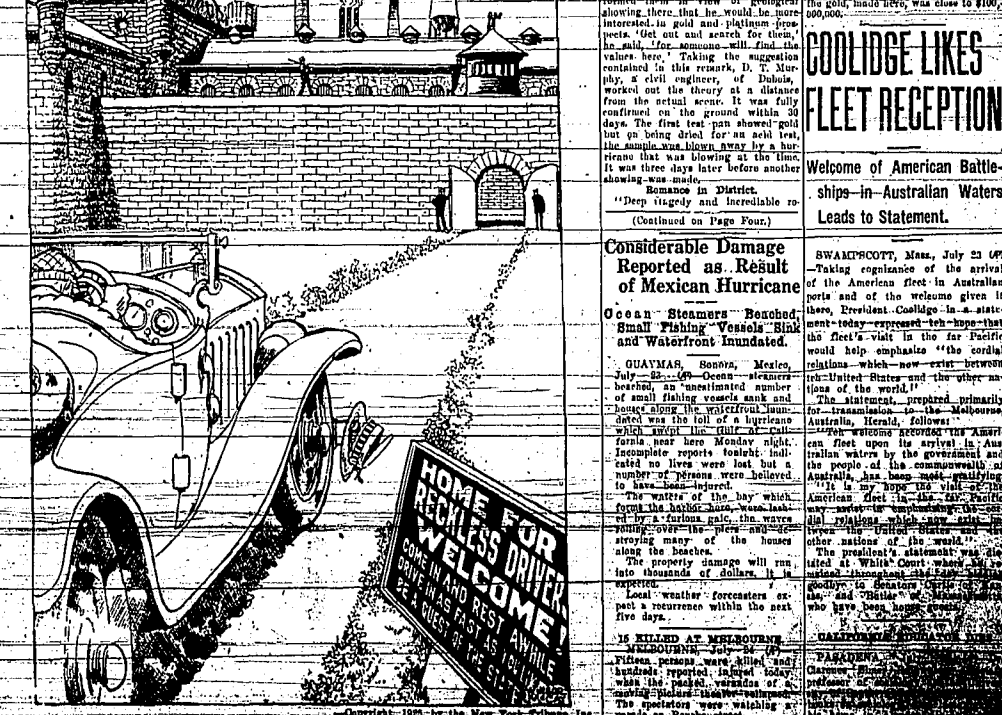

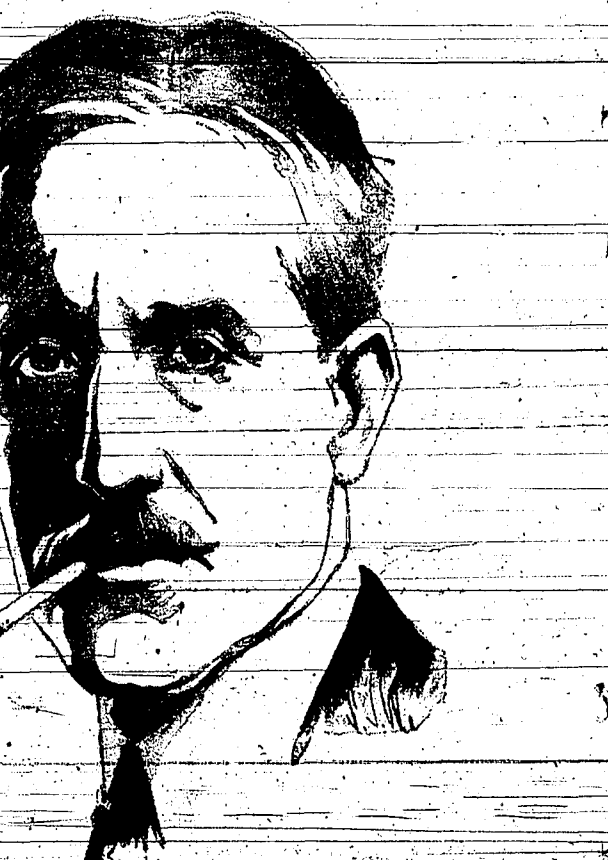

ACCUSE MEXICAN OF USING RAZOR

Felony Charge Comes Out of Lodging House Brawl; Police Chief Disarms Aggressor.

An ugly looking razor that was taken from the hand of one of the alleged principals in a brawl at the "Mexican" Mexican lodging house here, by Chief of Police H. E. Leighton early Wednesday, will be offered in evidence at the trial of a Mexican who has been complained against under the name of Jose LaPorte and who is charged with a felony assault with a deadly weapon upon Pedro Flores, a countryman. LaPorte spent a day and a night in the city jail and was delivered by the police Thursday afternoon into the custody of the sheriff.

An arraignment in prolate court Thursday afternoon LaPorte pleaded not guilty to the felony charge. He was represented by E. V. Larson, attorney. Flores, victim of the alleged assault, told the officers that LaPorte had killed a man in Utah. Flores admitted also that he himself had killed a man some years ago at a place and that at that place he was in an apartment, he had been represented by Attorney Larson.

Inept With Blade

Officers stated that LaPorte had done more damage with the razor in less than 10 minutes than any other man who was arrested at the same time and lodged in the same cell at the city jail with LaPorte, was one of those men who were arrested Thursday by Judge J. L. Mee in police court to pay fines aggregating \$10 for drunkenness.

During his sojourn in the city jail, officers stated Thursday, LaPorte figured to his own disadvantage in an altercation with a fellow prisoner, Frank Selton, a Blaine, charged with illegal possession of liquor, who took exception to LaPorte's interference with Selton's conversation with his wife through the bars of the jail door and proceeded to administer a sound thrashing in a hard fought and bloody battle that happened when the police chief intervened.

MARQUIS CURZON MAKES IMPORTANT REQUESTS TO GREAT BRITAIN-INWILL

LONDON, July 23 (AP)—The will of the late Marquis Curzon of Kedleston, which was probated yesterday, leaves a great value on his estate, in previous wills of \$1,000,000, with a net value of approximately \$1,000,000. Important bequests to the British nation indicate that in death as in life, the first thoughts of the dignified statesman, were of the empire. The document, which is very long and remarkable in its details, is in Curzon's personal hand writing, and was revised and signed the day before the operation that preceded his death last winter.

MOB BESIEGES ENEMY LEADER

Head of Aventine Opposition at Rome Saved by Police When Italians Storm Hotel.

ROME, July 23 (AP)—Deputy Amadeo, leader of the Aventine opposition in the Italian slaughter of deputy Amadeo, was saved by a mob of 100,000 men, including the fascist government, was besieged last night at the Hotel Excelsior in Montevideo for five hours by a mob of a thousand fascists, from whom he was saved by the intervention of police and fascist authorities.

Later during the night Amadeo was carried to a country road by 20 unknown men and beaten and gagged. He will not recover for several weeks.

The incident has caused a great impression both in government and opposition circles, causing it to do after the opening of a campaign in the fascist press to destroy the influence of the Aventine group.

The importance of the incident is shown in the fact that the press has permitted Amadeo's newspaper, *Il Lavoro*, to appear with a scathing attack against the government, while Premier Mussolini has issued an official version of the affair in which he asserts that the public authorities and the fascist press tried to protect the Aventine leader.

REORGANIZATION OF BANK NEARER

Boise Capitalists Incorporate Buhl State Bank; Receiver Asks Permission to Make Sale

Two steps in indicated reorganization of the First National bank of Buhl which closed its doors on March 19, last, were completed here Thursday. Articles of incorporation for the Buhl State bank, with fully subscribed capital stock of \$200,000, were filed in the office of the county recorder for Crawford Moore, Register, Mayor J. W. Cunningham, C. C. Anderson, Eugene Janney and E. A. Vandicklin, officers and directors of the First National bank of Buhl, Idaho, on Thursday. The bank is to be organized with a capital stock of the proposed new Buhl bank.

R. P. Danby of Twin Falls, receiver for the ancient First National bank of Buhl, filed in the office of the clerk of the district court here, his petition for permission to compromise, compound or sell the assets of that bank outside of the territory in all of the federal reserve bank which amounted in value to approximately \$240,000 and which were sold some time ago to the bank of Buhl.

No charter has yet been issued for the proposed new bank at Buhl. Permission for sale of the remaining free or unpledged assets of the defunct bank will not be granted for 30 days. An order requiring the receiver to file a statement of assets for 10 days to give time for objections to the proposed sale was signed by Judge W. A. Hobcock in district court when the receiver's petition was presented to the court Thursday.

Permission is asked by the receiver will assets of the bank of an estimated total value of approximately \$50,000, including nine pieces of real estate and banking house, furniture and fixtures, besides \$102,200 worth notes of face value of \$95,000; overdrafts amounting to \$400,000; claims and judgments amounting to \$17,284.04, and notes of face value of \$12,700; that had been accumulated in the recent receivership and charged off by the bank.

Strong Financial Interests

Interests of the proposed Buhl State bank include some of the best known and strongest financial interests of the state. Capital stock of the proposed bank is divided equally among the incorporators. The incorporation articles were executed at Boise June 24, last.

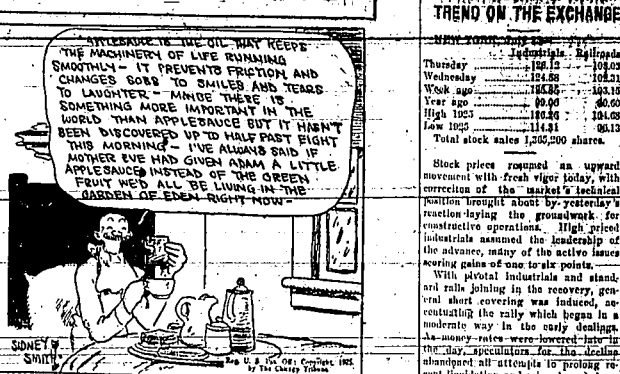
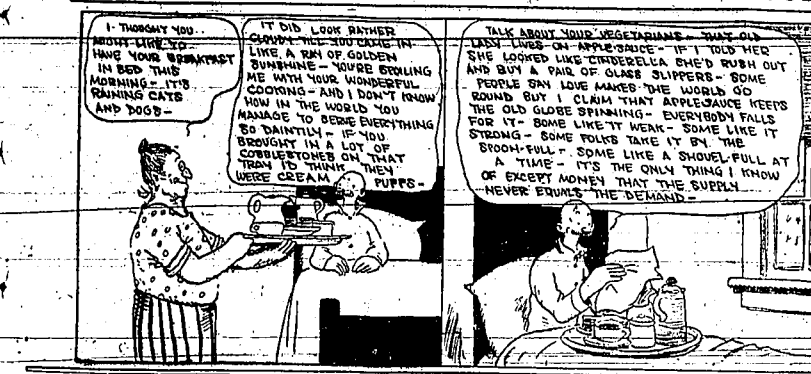

Preparations Complete for Twin Falls' First Observance of Pioneer Day With Feature Program.

Twin Falls will welcome today the largest crowd in its history when thousands of expected celebration visitors arrive to attend and take part in the events going to make up Twin Falls' first celebration of Pioneer Day.

Beginning at 9:30 a. m. the pageant of progress and industrial parade will start from the city park and will proceed to the stadium.

The Fort Hall Indians arrived at about 6 o'clock Thursday evening at the end of an all night trip from the Fort Hall reservation and at about the same time Tommie Thompson of the local mountain flying team arrived in great circles over the city and landed down on his landing field on the main street.
