### CONTAINES WATER TO SALMON AREA

#### Federal Court Issues Temporary Order Against Use of Available Supply Outside.

Available water supply for the Salmon River project may be used to furnish water for lands in the Salmon area, according to a court order issued today. The order was issued by Judge F. R. Murphy in federal district court at Boise. The restraining order was issued on motion of certain defendants and intervenors in the case of the Peoples Savings and Trust company, et al., against A. E. Caldwell and others, defendants, and the Twin Falls Trust company and others, intervenors.

In support of the motion it was alleged that the plaintiff corporation and its agents were seeking to divert water to lands outside the restricted area, waters that should be, apparently to that area.

### Court's Order

The court order which is to be made effective when defendants and intervenors furnish a bond, requires that the plaintiff corporation and its agents from making any further application or taking any further steps or loaning their assistance in any way, to the furthering of applications for additional patents for lands to be watered by the waters filed upon for use upon said irrigation, or from attempting to further transfer shares of water stock from patented lands to lands not heretofore patented in any manner whatsoever. Provided that the time limit beyond which the acreage for which the entire water supply of the Salmon River Canal company is available shall not be increased beyond 50,000 irrigable acres, and upon a showing that an additional permit will not result, in such instance, plaintiff may, at any time, upon notice, take in order permitting it and its agents to proceed with the application for such patents.

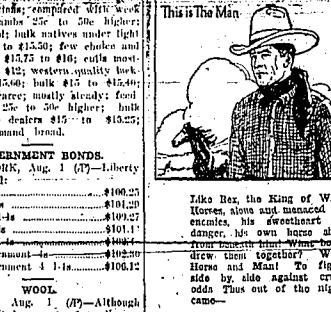
