**WAHLINGSTON**, Aug. 5 (AP)—Operating income of class 1 railroads during the first six months of this year was placed by the bureau of railway economics at \$31,988,257, compared with \$31,988,257 during the same period last year.

The bureau estimated that the net return for the six months of the year was \$1,000,000 less than the amount received on property investment compared with \$1,12 for the same period last year.

The class 1 roads which have a total

operating revenue amount of \$2,500,000,000 in the six months, an increase of \$2,438,000 or nearly one per cent over the same period last year. Operating expenses were \$2,188,000,000, also at \$2,238,47,700, a reduction of \$35,430,440, or 1.6 per cent under those for the corresponding period last year, although freight traffic was estimated to have increased 2.2 per cent.

17, '25). In addition various colored signs will be placed to give warnings of dangerous curves, railroad crossings and the condition of the road surface.

The exact routing of the main highways will not be determined until the sub-committee makes its recommendations to the various state highway departments, who will have power to make the final decision. The routing will be guided mainly by metropolitan cities, state capitals, railroads and points of general interest.

No new road construction is involved in the system other than roads now planned under the federal aid program. The state has no power to make roads, nor can it afford to pay for any alteration in the present regular highways, but will devote its efforts to the purchase of signs. The system will be built up gradually, covering the entire country, including stretches extending over several states along with short spur of only a few miles. Under the plan the state's "motorist" will be constantly informed of his location by the markers which will be posted at frequent intervals.

The plan will be developed by W. N. James of the Bureau of public roads, chairman; F. T. Shultz of Springfield, Ill.; R. H. Peplow of Jefferson City, Mo.; C. A. Gluck of Salem, Oregon; Charles H. Moseley of Columbia, S. C., and Cyrus C. Avery, Oklahoma City, Okla.

## CIDER VENDORS ARE PENALIZED

Five Twin Falls Men Found  
Guilty of Violation of Dry  
Law; Will Appeal.

Five Twin Falls men caught by the police in a round-up some weeks ago in alleged vendors of hard cider, were found guilty of illegal possession of liquor and each was sentenced to pay \$200 fine or serve 20 days in jail as a result of their crime before Judge J. L. Hudgill, presiding court here Wednesday. Each man was given a choice of either payment of fine or imprisonment.

Each vendor, however, was granted a stay of appeal to the district court.

Brooks was sentenced only in the case of A. W. Schaffner, one of the accused men, the defense of which against each being identical except for variation in the method of determining the samples of cider as determined by the chemist.

Other accused, however, were Peter Minns, M. A. Wilson, J. H. Stillwell and Victor Grenzow.

The sample of cider taken by the police from Schaffner's establishment contained 1 per cent alcohol, according to testimony of H. L. Walter, city and county chemist. Schaffner, in his own defense, testified that he was not "sure" how much alcohol was in the cider he sold.

He said he had no means of testing the cider other than by tasting it, he said.
