QUALITY AT LOW COST

Weekly and Monthly Forecasts.
It was only a few years ago that scientists claimed weekly weather forecasts to be an impossibility; but today the weather bureau in Washington is putting out an estimate of what the weather will be for the next seven days, having the same accuracy as the weather bureau usually takes. Such work, however, is still in its infancy and has not yet been satisfactory. While the weather bureau is doing some excellent work in this direction, Argentina, under the direction of Huxmark, its official forecaster, leads in long range weather forecasting. In our own country numerous experts are making extended investigations. H. H. Clayton of California, George P. Bunker of Chicago, and Albert C. Smithson of Indianapolis, are among the most prominent men are doing very good work in this direction. Dr. Albert C. Smithson's theory is based on the variation in the amount of heat received from the sun on the various parts of the earth, which is measured by his staff. It is also believed that these changes in the sun's heat radiations can be predicted. 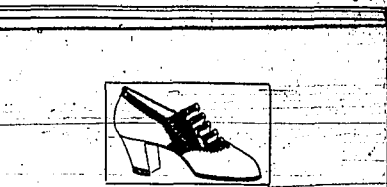

Engine for Barling Bomber to be the Largest and Heaviest Ever-Put Into Airplane.

DAYTON, Ohio, Aug. 9.—The Dayton News today says that an airplane motor, capable of furnishing power for the Barling bomber, the world's largest airplane, is being built for Meekins field. It will be the most powerful gasoline engine ever constructed, the News states. 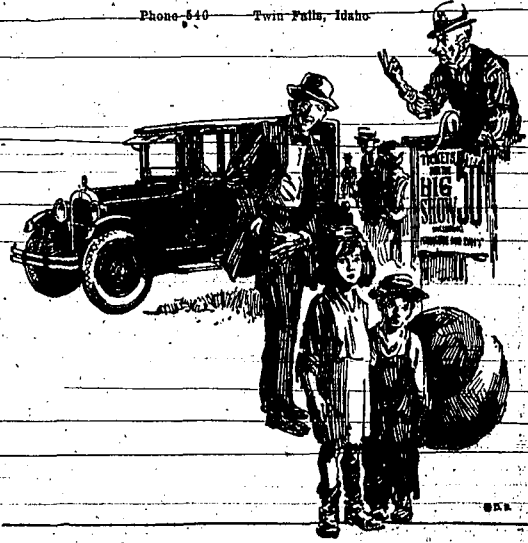

DAMAGE SOUGHT FOR WATER LACK

A. E. Caldwell Elles, Suit in District Court for \$22,784. From Canal Company.

A. E. Caldwell of the Salmon tract Saturday filed suit in the district court for \$22,784 against the company, alleging damage to that extent during 1921, '22 and '23 as the result of failure to receive water for 500 acres of land for crops.

Changes are made in the papers filed Saturday by the plaintiff that he is the owner of 500 shares of the canal stock of the company and that in 1921, he offered the treasurer of the company \$1 an acre in advance to purchase the water for 500 acres of land for crops. This offer was refused by the company. The plaintiff says and the plaintiff was refused water for his land that was the rate of one-fourth of a cubic foot of water per acre. As a result plaintiff claimed damages of \$22,784. In addition to which one-fourth of the water rights are claimed to have been killed off causing an additional loss of \$1832 on an 80-acre field. Another 80 acres was under cultivation, the complaint sets out and lack of water resulted in a loss of \$300.

Further Losses Claimed. In 1922 lack of water caused a loss in the amount of \$1832 on 80 acres of land to 16000 with one-third of the plants are claimed to have been killed off, causing further loss of \$1832. This is a total of \$3000. The result of a lack of water, doing an estimated damage of \$2000.

This condition it is also claimed in the complaint continued in 1923 with further loss. In 1923 the complaint says water was turned out of a canal from the district court, for 80 acres of the land. Total damage during the years mentioned, is set out at \$22,784, which the defendants asks from the canal company.

Attorneys for the plaintiff are given as O. C. Hall, E. M. Wolfe and Oron Wilkins.

He denied the statement of the elder Pate that Deputy Sheriff Charles Jones had sworn with Ralph Pink, a member of the jury on the day of the trial. Ralph Pink, Deputy Sheriff Jones, and two daughters of Pate testified.
