ESCAPED CONVICT IS CHARGED WITH DOUBLE KILLING

Indiana Man and His Wife Shot to Death; Slayer Identified by Victim as Companion of Noted Bandit.

(By The Associated Press) MUNCIE, Ind., Aug. 14 (AP)—"One Arm" Wolf, said to be one of the companions of George "Big Boy" Barker, was today shot and killed. His wife and his wife became victims of a double killing last January of the whereabouts of Gerald Chapman, notorious mail robber, was captured by local police at 10:45 o'clock tonight driving through this city.

Informed Authorities. While Chapman and Anderson were in hiding at Hance's home last winter, Hance informed police authorities and Chapman was surrounded on the streets of Muncie last January 14 and captured.

Chapman was reported to be visiting Muncie at intervals and making his headquarters at the Hance home. Several days later he was seen in the city and was successful in escaping arrest January 18.

Police, acting on information that Chapman was at the Hance home, surrounded the place and after several hours the escaped prisoner was captured. Two officers fell in step behind him, while an automobile load of officers drove up to the Hance home. Officers alighted from the car, Chapman whipped out a pistol and opened fire. The shot was with a great accuracy and the officers overpowered him.

Chapman was taken to the local jail and federal authorities were immediately notified of his capture. He was turned over to the police and held for a few hours later and released in Indianapolis in order to forestall any efforts by his associates to engineer a delivery.

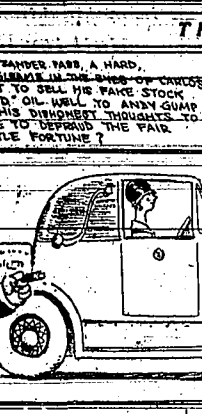

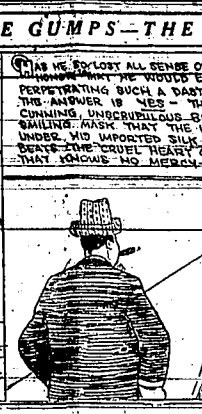

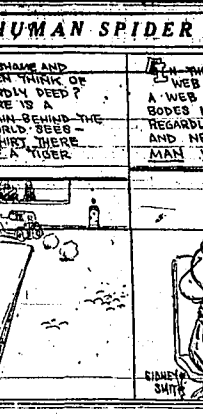
