Former Chief Executive of Oregon Challenges Official and Warden to Search Thicket for Escaped Convicts.

PORTLAND, Aug. 15 (AP)—Oswald West, former governor of Oregon, has issued a challenge to Governor Walter M. Pierce and Warden Dolan to enter Drift Creek canyon where two escaped convicts are believed to be hiding.

West's charge will appear in a statement recently published in which he criticized the warden in connection with the escape of the convicts last night, when two guards and another escaping convict were killed.

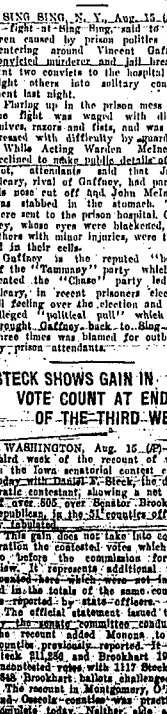

Fire Damages Placed at Million; 6 Story Packing Plant Goes

Big Cement Structure in Chicago Gutted by Flames; Property of G. H. Hammond and Company.

CHICAGO, Aug. 15 (AP)—Fire of undetermined origin today gutted the six-story cement structure of the G. H. Hammond and Company, meat packer, in the heart of the stock yards district, causing damage estimated by insurers at upwards of \$1,000,000.

The employees left without excitement while dense smoke filled the structure, making it difficult for firemen to locate the source of the flames which may have started from a gasoline station in the butterfat storage room.

### OUTLOOK FAVORS IDAHO'S CROPS

#### August Report Promises Wheat Crop of 26,374,000 Bushels; Nation's Crop Short.

Although there has been some damage from weather and local hot storms, says the August crop report just issued by J. H. Johnson, agricultural statistician for the United States department of agriculture, the outlook continues favorable for large production of all the principal crops in Idaho. The wheat crop promises a total of 26,374,000 bushels, or 317,149 bushels more than indicated by the 1924 crop.

On the other hand, the Idaho potato crop is estimated to be 191 million bushels less than the 574 million bushels raised last year. It must be noted, however, that the 1924 crop was also less than the 1923 crop.

The Idaho crop is forecast at 11,931,000 bushels, slightly less than last year. The early crop in the Nampa (Caldwell district) is turning out very good, but some concern is expressed because of the July weather and early digging under the size of high prices.

The Idaho potato crop is placed at 253 million bushels, an improvement of 3 million bushels over last month. Idaho growers should remember that the United States crop is still 100 million bushels below the 1924 and 65 million bushels below the average for the past five years. In 1924 weather conditions were particularly favorable in eastern states and there was steady improvement in the season's progress.

This was reflected in the monthly forecasts of the U. S. crop, which were as follows: July 275 million bushels; August 400 million; September 473 million; October 457 million; November 454 million; and December 453 million bushels. This year there is 57 per cent less crop than last year and weather conditions up to August 1 have been favorable.

The United States crop is estimated to be 122 million bushels less than last year and weather, however, a recent movement of 600 cars is still indicated, causing the commercial crop to be estimated 30 per cent less than the 1924 crop, or 22 per cent less than the 1923 crop, and 62 per cent less than the 1922 crop.

The United States apple crop is expected to be the smallest since 1921. The 191 million bushel crop indicated August 1 is 10 per cent less than last year's crop and 14 per cent less than the 1924 crop. As a result, the outlook for the commercial apple crop is relatively better because of the larger crops expected in several leading commercial apple states, particularly in New York, Illinois, Michigan, Idaho and Washington.

This year Idaho, Oregon and Washington are expected to produce 10 per cent more than last year's crop, but approximately 20 per cent less than the 1924 crop.

RE-INDICTMENT WILL BE ASKED OF LOONEY FOR MURDER OF MAN

BOON ISLAND, Aug. 15 (AP)—Indictment of LOONEY for the murder of William Gabel, a saloon keeper, in 1922, will be asked of the federal grand jury sitting here today called next Monday, Hon. H. Bell, state attorney, said tonight.

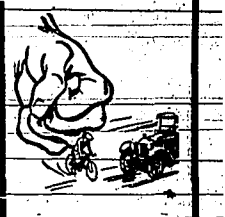

# SUNDAY DRAMA IS CALLED OFF UNDER THREAT

Chautauqua Association Abandons Plan to Fill Out Season With Play When Protestors Resort to Law.

Under threat of criminal prosecution made by Rev. Arthur G. Pearson, president of the Twin Falls Ministerial alliance, the Twin Falls Chautauqua association Saturday abandoned the plan to finish the season with the chautauqua feature play, "Daddy Long Legs," that was not given last Thursday as originally scheduled because of wrangling of the chautauqua group by a "rotten wind" storm.

Instead, the association announced arrangements have been made either for return of the "Daddy Long Legs" company or for staging of another dramatic performance at a later date to fill out the 1925 chautauqua course here.

Decision to abandon the plan to present the chautauqua play today was reached following a conference Saturday morning in the office of J. W. Taylor, county attorney, in which Mr. Pearson appeared as the spokesman for opponents of the proposed Sunday performance, and Burton E. Morse represented the chautauqua association.

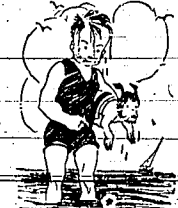
Prepared to Prosecute  
The county attorney at this conference stated his opinion that the proposed performance would violate provisions of the state law that prohibit operation of "circuses, theaters, motion picture houses or shows" except in cases where the citizens of a municipality have voted to permit such performances on Sunday. He advised further that any person who objected to the proposed performance might arrest out warrants of arrest to be served on management and performers in the event the performance were attempted.

Mr. Pearson stated that he was prepared to arrest out warrants of arrest under such circumstances. No decision was reached at this conference, and subsequently E. V. Stout, chautauqua manager, advised Mr. Taylor with a proposal that there should be substituted for the proposed dramatic performance, a musical program that should be made up largely of sacred music. He stated that no charge would be made for the offering that would be given with the sole purpose of fulfilling the obligation of the chautauqua to holders of season tickets. Mr. Taylor declined to alter his original opinion and advised against any attempt to give any chautauqua performance here on Sunday.

Tells Protestors Position  
Mr. Pearson stated Saturday evening that he had been accused by a number in the affair, but that he represented the view of many persons who objected to Sunday amusements. "I am for the chautauqua and will aid it in every way possible, but I am opposed to Sunday shows whether given by it or any other agency. As a matter of justice I feel that the law that prevents operation of our own theaters and motion picture shows on Sunday ought not to be evaded to permit the chautauqua or any other outside institution to give Sunday shows."

"I have acted throughout this affair to give Mr. Stout warning as to the consequences if the attempt to present a Sunday performance were persisted in so that he might have had more time to make other arrangements. The people who have been protesting against the proposed Sunday performances feel that the amusements made to chautauqua null.

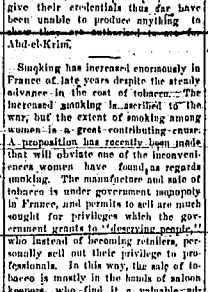
Mrs. Wilson's desire to be "just an ordinary American visitor," has been generally respected by the French authorities and the newspaper men of both France and America.
