Professor Defends Statement Against Evolution Theory

Ten Million Americans Discredit Eminent Geologist at Union College; Address Is Interrupted.

LONDON, Sept. 7. (AP)—"Ten million Americans signed a petition," said George McCready Price, professor of geology at Union College, York, Pa., when he was speaking in an evolution theory was shouted down last night asserted today in an interview with a reporter.

Dr. Price spoke last night. His audience interrupted him frequently, and finally a persistent young woman heckled him to stop speaking.

"The female of the species, I guess, is more docile than the male," Professor Price said today in an interview given the Evening News, commenting on last night's incident. The Evening News correspondent quoted him as follows:

"I guess what I said got under their skins. Young Americans are tough at anything American. You don't think anything good can come out of America until you have been accepted here in England for forty or fifty years and now they think it must be right."
