Engineer Instantly Killed When Rogerson Branch Line Engine Hurtles from Rails

E. L. Thompson Crushed to Death by Tender on Crossing Near This City When Obstruction Derails Train.

Early today a road grader on a railroad crossing a main line and a passenger train... Wednesday afternoon is believed to have caused the derailment and overturning of the locomotive of the Oregon Short Line Twin Falls branch train in which E. L. Thompson, an engineer, was instantly killed.

The engineer's body was removed from between the front wheels of the tank, which remained on the rails. It is believed that he had been thrown or tripped from his seat at the right side of the engine as it started west to the left and fell between the tank and the engine.

Runs Along on Ties The locomotive that was bringing a train of eight freight cars and one combination baggage and passenger train from Boise to Twin Falls, traveled on the ties for about 150 feet after the pilot wheels were lifted from the rails at the crossing.

Worked along the splintered ties and the engine, it is believed, was turned over the edge of a trestle about three feet high, falling on the trestle, in a cloud of steam and fire, and escaped water.

Then the fireman, under great strain, brought run to the rear of the train, bringing word of the wreck. It was a most unusual accident.

Trouble Starts When Negro Family Moves Into Residential Section Where Attempts Are Made to Force Them Out.

DETROIT, Sept. 9 (AP)—Leon Brown, a Negro, was shot and instantly killed and his wife and child were seriously injured by a mob of whites in a residential section here tonight. The trouble started when a Negro family moved into a section previously inhabited only by white persons. The men shot were white.

Police reporters were called to the house last night when missiles were thrown through the windows in an effort to force the family to leave. The negroes determined to stay in the property and tonight a crowd of about a several thousand persons gathered at the house.

According to witnesses, the crowd tonight made no attempt to enter the property, but the negroes, seeing the persons outside, opened fire. Both of the men shot by bullets fired in the mob, but the negroes were not hurt.

(By The Associated Press) NEW YORK, Sept. 9.—The second shooting in Chinatown within 24 hours resulted tonight in the death of Que Yee, a cook, who was fatally wounded in a house on Hester street. The police arrested Chin Hing on a charge of felonious assault. Hing fled from the dwelling after the shooting and was captured after being pursued by police and a crowd of 200 persons.

More than 40 shots were exchanged in Chinatown last night between detectives and Chinese in a battle in the district dominated by the On Lung tong. The detectives were searching for weapons and ammunition which they had seized in their search of the neighborhood when they were fired on by Chinese.

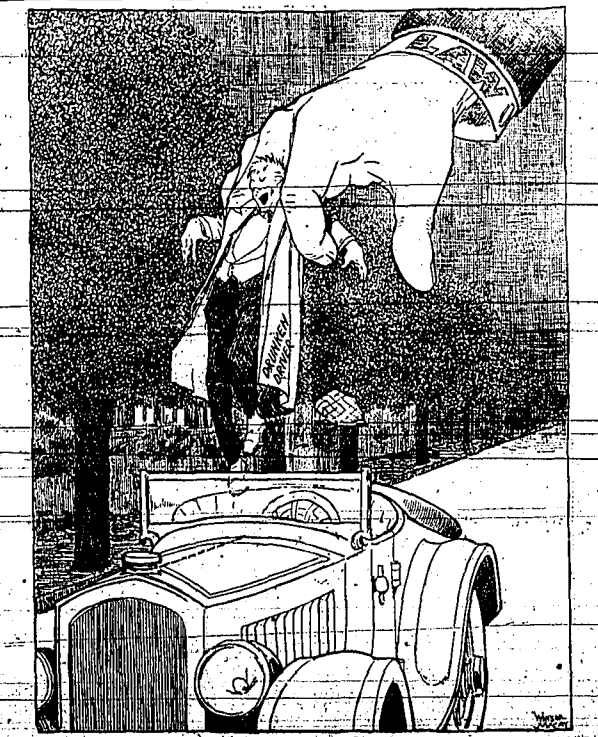

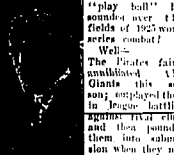
