Football Material at High School This Year Mostly of No Experience; Practice Gets Under Way.

With more than 25 aspirants out in suits kicking up clouds of dust every night at Lincoln field, Coach Pillsbury and those who assist him are well on their way to the first season with their green squad. While the material is plentiful, it is green, very green at the Emerald track. The most experienced warrior in a suit has had two years on the squad and the vast majority have done the rushing for the first time this season.

Thomson and Alford left a gap in the backfield that you can strike a wild flock of crows through. Forzer left the center of the line wide open and Farrar leaves the end uncovered. ## RURAL HIGH SCHOOL AT PILER MAKES ADVANCE

PILER, Sept. 17.—The Piler rural high school opened Monday with an increase in enrollment over last year. All the students in the district are enrolled with over 25 per cent of them residing outside the school district. Five years ago the school enrolled 45 pupils, of whom only 25 resided outside the district.

Six members of the faculty are serving their third year in their present positions and only two vacancies have occurred on the staff in the last three years. This year Sidney McLaughlin, a graduate of the College of Idaho, and an experienced teacher, takes charge of science and directs athletics. Miss Valena Grady, a graduate of Willamette university, directs the English department and directs vocal music.

Four regular courses of study developed last year have been perfected this year and each student follows a definite course in either agriculture, home economics, commerce or college preparation. A four year course in each of these lines of study is offered. Enrollment and registration took place on Monday morning. Lessons were assigned and books purchased on Monday afternoon.
