

ENGINEERS WILL RECOMMEND BRIDGE TO RIM BRIDGE

Dr. D. B. Steinman of New York Will Carry Favorable Report to Eastern Capital for Investment in Canyon Span.

Dr. D. B. Steinman of New York, president of the American Association of Engineers, a noted designer and builder of bridges, will recommend to eastern investors whom he represents that they furnish the money required for construction of a great steel bridge to span Snake river canyon from rimrock to rimrock at Blue lakes, directly north of here.

Dr. Steinman, who has been here for three days studying anticipated traffic over the proposed span, made this announcement Friday evening at a luncheon given at the hotel here by the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce.

As a result of my study here, Dr. Steinman stated, I believe that a toll-bridge at Blue lakes would be a paying proposition and I shall recommend it to the eastern investors by whom I have been well known.

Estimate of cost of the bridge was given by Dr. Steinman at from \$100,000 to \$200,000, depending somewhat on whether the suspension arch type of span is determined upon.

Span of 1350 Feet.

A suspension bridge at this point Dr. Steinman stated, would be a span of 1350 feet and would be the longest suspension span west of Philadelphia in this country and the longest suspension span in the world.

As an arch type bridge at this point would be approximately 1000 feet long, Dr. Steinman said, and would be the highest arch bridge in the world, with the possible exception of a much smaller span over Yellowstone canyon.

Leaves Today.

Dr. Steinman will leave here this morning for New York.

Construction of the bridge would be completed within a year after the signing of the contract, Dr. Steinman stated.

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JAIL FREEDOM COST \$20,500

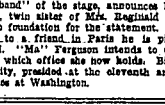
