TILDEN REMAINS
KING OF TENNIS

Champion Wins Title for Sixth
Consecutive Year; Defeats
Johnston in Hard Game.

YORBBT HILF, N. Y., Sept. 19. (AP)
—WILSON TILDEN, 11, remains undisputed
king of tennis in America and for that
matter, the world. He won the title
for the sixth consecutive year today
when he turned back the stout-
hearted challenge of his veteran rival,
Wesley Johnston, of California, in five
sets after a long struggle.
The scores were 1-0, 11-0, 6-3, 4-6,
6-3, but Johnston failed to over-
throw the champion who now has
won the California's comeback at-
tempt for its respective years nor do
the figures reveal the title holder's
points in moments of peril and his final
dominance through superior striking
and stamina.
It is doubtful whether in all the long
history of Tilden's domination, few
have these rivals ever engaged in a more
spectacular fight. Johnston, since his
first national championship victory over
Tilden in 1919 has been close to dis-
franchising the champion than he was
today. Three years ago the Californian
was within a few points of triumphing
when he had taken the first two sets.
Today he was far from having Tilden
back close to defeat, but he won three
times within a point of taking the sec-
ond set and gaining an advantage
which would have been enough to
bring him back to the front. Johnston
might have beaten down even Tilden's
brilliant resources. As it was, Tilden's
powers prevailed and he turned back
Johnston's greatest bid in a struggle
for points that had the capacity crowd
of 10,000 in the West Side club's stand
in an edge and headless with ex-
citement.
His setback, heart-breaking to John-
ston at the time, might have occurred
anyway, but the plucky Californian,
instead of yielding, as he would,
after Tilden had swept through the
third set, Johnston came back with
unbelievable spirit to win the fourth
set and square the match. He had the
big crowd again in an uproar as he
grained a lead in the final set, but
strength was unequal to the task of
keeping up the pace.
Tilden, again rising to the emergency
with startling flights of tennis called
in his apparent inexhaustible store of
reserve energy to gain the victory. He
was irrefragable in this final drive,
which culminated typically with his
ace shot with a terrific cannonball
service shot for the final point.
Tilden's attainment of the
straight championship, giving him per-
manent possession of his second title
today, leaves no doubt that he still has
full command of the game which has
settled him to an unparalleled place in
tennisdom.
